

ARTS AND CULTURE

Day 1: Exploring the City Bowl

- Start your day in the Mother City by visiting Cape Town's iconic Clocktower at the V&A Waterfront, a symbol of the city's rich seafaring history. From here take the ferry to Robben Island, a world heritage site dedicated to preserving the history of the Apartheid struggle.
- On your return, enjoy a seafood lunch at the Harbour House, with spectacular views of the V&A Waterfront
- Take a cab or shuttle to the city centre and head down to **Green Market Square** for shopping of **African art and curios** in the cobbled streets.
- Stroll down the buzzing **Long Street**, and discover hidden gems at 33 stores from 14 African countries at the **Pan African Market**.
- Finish the day with an **authentic African meal** at the **Africa Café**.

Day 2: Simon's Town and Kalk Bay

- The day begins on the opposite side of the mountain at Kalk Bay. Stroll along the Arts and Antiques Mile, visit the eccentric Kalk Bay Bookshop and enjoy a coffee with sweet treats at Olympia Café.
- Head towards **Kalk Bay harbour** where local fishermen return in colourful boats with the day's catch. Complete the experience with a parcel of fresh fish and chips for **lunch** at the much-loved **Kalky's Fisheries**.
- For panoramic views of the coast, make your way towards Simon's Town on the Southern Line Railroute coastal train ride.
- On arrival, visit the historic Submarine Museum at the naval dockyard and then finish the day by browsing the collection of charming vintage stores along Main Road and at the Quayside Waterfront.

Day 3: Hout Bay and Noordhoek

- Start your day at the **Hout Bay harbour Craft**Market for a browse around the native arts
 and crafts.
- Take a walking tour through the township of Imizamo Yethu to experience vibrant local culture and cuisine, ending at the Original Tea Bag Design Studio and shop.
- Enjoy the world-renowned scenery of Chapman's Peak drive as you make your way towards the Noordhoek Farm Village. Visit the Farmer's Market for freshly baked goods and local produce, followed by lunch at Toad in the Village.
- Move on towards **Slangkop** to visit the **tallest** cast iron lighthouse in **Kommetjie**.
- Finish your day at the glamorous Camps Bay strip with a sundowner at one of the trendy hot spots, such as The Kove, The Bungalow, and Café Caprice.

Day 4: Discovering the Cape Flats

- Embark on the authentic Cape Flats Tour Route with the Koesister Safari. This comprehensive, full day tour takes you into the Cape Flats community to get a glimpse of the unsung heroes of the Apartheid era. Pay your respects at the Freedom Fighters Memorial, and witness the talent of the Performing Arts School of Dance, Ballet, and Drama.
- Enjoy lunch at Wembley Roadhouse in Athlone, Belgravia Road, an iconic take-away eatery rich in culture and reputation.
- Spend the rest of the day discovering the diversity of **Athlone** an area that has proudly been delivering unique artists and musicians such as Basil "Manenberg" Coetzee, Robbie Jansen, Jonathan Butler, Richard John Smith, Brenda Fassie, and Mac Mckenzie.

Day 5: A Day in Durbanville

- Start your final day by visiting the **Rust-en-Vrede Art Gallery** in **Durbanville**, 'where Culture and
 Leisure meet'. Enjoy a cup of freshly brewed
 coffee and a selection of homemade treats at
 the Rust-en-Vrede Art Café.
- Move on to **Durbanville Hills Wine Estate**where you can admire the views of Robben Island
 and Table Mountain, the new seventh wonder
 of the world. Here you embark on a private cellar
 tour and savour the fusion of fine wine and
 artisan chocolate pairing.
- A lunch of fusion cuisine can be enjoyed at **The Eatery**, located on the farm.
- finish your day with a local performance accompanied by a delicious dinner at the very popular Villa Pascal Theatre in Durbanville.
