ACCOMMODATION AND FACILITIES

10 African Style Thatched Bungalows are well-spaced on a leafy hillside close to the main Ohange building. Each is stone-built and equipped with comfortable twin beds, ceiling-fan, tea and coffee facilities, and large en-suite shower room with open-plan WC and washbasin. From their shaded verandah, Guests can enjoy uninterrupted views of distant mountains and the wildlife around the nearby waterhole, illuminated after dark.

4 Self-Catering Chalets, sited a little further up the mountainside, have fully equipped kitchen, comfortable twin beds and en-suite open plan shower, WC and washbasin.

4 Self-Catering Twin-Bedded (Stable) Rooms - simple and economic, with communal ablution and cooking facilities. One Room shares ablution and kitchen facilities with one Campsite.

2 Campsites shaded by enormous old trees, and close to an old German stable block (Stalle). One Campsite is exclusive, sharing kitchen facilities and ablution block with one Stable Room - the other has communal facilities and an ablution block.

Ohange's Main Complex comprises Reception, Dining Room, Bar and other essential services. The verandah and nearby camp-fire area are used for dining at most times of the year. Our tasty breakfast is also served here.

ACTIVITIES

Our aim at Ohange is to enjoy the wildlife as it was intended - naturally. To entice you away from the cool of the pool or the shade of the Lodge verandah, we organise exhilarating morning nature walks and afternoon gameviewing drives in search of Eland, Damara Dik-dik, Giraffe, Burchell's Zebra, Hartmann's Mountain Zebra, Waterbuck, Impala, Black Wildebeest, Kudu, Oryx, Cheetah and many more . . .

If you prefer a more leisurely approach, you are invited to take a guided hike or horse-ride to explore the area - an ideal way to discover some of the extraordinarily abundant bird-life. Or the more adventurous could go out on foot without a guide.

After dusk we venture out to search for the treasures of the night - Bushbabies (or nagapies meaning 'little night monkeys'), Porcupines, Genet, Owls and Nightjars. With luck we might even encounter a free-roaming Leopard!

Other local points of interest: the Ghaub Caves, Lake Otjikoto, Etosha National Park and Hoba Meteorite.

Directions

It is extremely easy to drive to Ohange Namibia Lodge from any direction.

From Windhoek: take the B1 north.

From Etosha or Ondangwa: take the B1 south.

From Zambezi via Rundu: take the B8 south-west to Otavi, then the B1 north.

Ohange is situated in the Otavi Mountains on the tarred B1 main highway, approximately 28 km north of Otavi and 30 km south of Tsumeb.

The gateway to Ohange Namibia Lodge is on the eastern side of the B1 and the beautiful 3 km drive from there to the Lodge is good enough for non 4x4 vehicles
