Khayelitshe House's charm comes from its simplicity and organic blueprint. Drawing inspiration from travels throughout Africa, the eclectic design brings tranquility and energy. This is a home that is completely offgrid, one that inspires peacefulness and being at one with nature.

The private land around Khayelitshe House covers 1200 acres of breath taking wilderness, making it a beautiful escape from every day life.
