Location

The central Tuli is a vast, wild landscape in excess of 60,000 hectares bordering the Northern Tuli. It is completely unfenced and is home to numerous species of fauna and flora, among them elephant, eland, brown and spotted hyena and bat eared fox to name but a few. Koro has become known for its phenomenal leopard sightings that go hand in hand with the research that is run from Koro Camps. The birdlife is prolific especially along the riparian forests that clearly mark the majestic Limpopo river's journey. Beautiful secluded permanently seeping natural springs in the hills are a major game and bird attraction, particularly for elephant into the dry season. The Tuli skyline is a spectacular mix of inslebergs or rocky outcrops, huge Candelabra trees and Giant Baobabs which have, in part given the area its local name "land of giants", the other part of the name lies in the gentle giants, the elephant that wander the area making it as beguiling today as yesteryear.

Access

By road - Koro is a mere 550kms from Oliver Tambo International. A high clearance vehicle can make it all the way, alternatively we will meet and transfer you from Platjan border post to the camp. From Gaborone it is 550kms and from Polokwane it is 240kms.
By Air – Angel Gabriel offers direct flights from Lanseria Johannesburg to Limpopo Valley Airport (1.5hrs) where we collect and road transfer the final 50kms. Flights are also offered to Polokwane from where we would arrange a road transfer for the remainder of the trip. Angel Gabriel also offer set weekly flights from Maun as well as Madikwe which opens up packaging options.

Camp

With a timeless air of intrigue and luxury, Koro River Camp nestles comfortably into the shady, wild banks of the Limpopo River. There is an untamed, intangible air around the camp and it is this enveloping comfort that provides a catalyst for breaking boundaries, personal reflection and healing....we call it re-souling!
The common areas consist of an inviting and shaded deck, indoor dining room and bar, a private cosy lounge where one can hide with a book or a pair of binoculars, a small exclusive gift shop, a wellness sala for some quiet pampering and a central boma fireplace.
Privacy is of the utmost consideration making Koro the ideal safari retreat!

Conservation

Conservation tourism is the core of all our operations and is very important to Albert Hartog, founder of The Africa Experience, Albert set up a foundation, TIMBO AFRIKA to fund and support numerous conservation and community projects. At Koro, TIMBO AFRIKA funds an accredited PhD level field study, focussing on the ecology of leopards and hyenas of the Tuli. This includes the highly endangered Kalahari icon, the brown hyena. We invite our guests to participate in monitoring activities and field observations. Our deep rooted philanthropic and conservation passion has created various community development programs. A 'bee barrier' project is underway to help alleviate elephant conflict with local farmers, and wildlife education programs are supported at the Mathathane primary school. Visits to the village sites outside are highly recommended. All tourism profits go directly back to the foundation to be plowed back into the conservation of the area, its cultural heritage and its people.
