

Saruni Leopard Hill is a contemporary take on traditional Maasai architecture, and lets you connect with the ancient rhythms of Africa, and of the cosmos. During the day, you can enjoy the views out over the waterhole and the iconic fig trees – ancient survivors that have cultural significance for our Maasai neighbours. At night, press a button and the tent roof above your head will open, giving you unrestricted views of the planets and constellations. Situated in a very special place where the savannah meets the sky, Saruni Leopard Hill offers a vantage point for the ages – back to the dawn of the universe, and forward to a brave new world of community-focused conservation. It's time to take a fresh look at the Mara.



Saruni Basecamp believes fully and invests significantly in community development and conservation.

- The majority of the team members at Saruni Leopard Hill are Maasai from the local communities. They are trained and employed to enable local communities to benefit directly from the lodge being in their area.
- Opportunities are provided for local artisans to sell their craft items, giving them an alternative revenue stream and contributing to the revival of interest in traditional skills.
- Saruni Basecamp sponsors young Maasai to train as guides at the Wildlife Tourism College of Maasai Mara, and lead future generations of conservationists and safari guides.
- The camp helps to protect the Masai Mara ecosystem, and contributes to the preservation of the Mara Naboisho Conservancy.
