GUIDED WALKING SAFARIS

Over 300 different bird species have been recorded at Royal Malewane, and a focused birding safari can help you add a great many 'lifers' to your list. Our Guides and Trackers are all exceptional birders, and will use their knowledge of habitats, behaviour and calls to help you spot species you've not seen before – and perhaps some you've not even heard of.

While you may not always be in sight of a mammal on your game drives, there is rarely a time when birds cannot be seen or heard, and deepening your interest in ornithology will add nuance and richness to your time at Royal Malewane.



STAR SAFARIS

MOLOLOHOLO WILDLIFE REHABILITATION CENTRE

A second chance for injured creatures

Every year, wild animals in the Greater Kruger vehicle are unfortunately injured by fences, vehicles and poachers. Fortunately, many of them get a second chance to live out their lives in the wild thanks to the Mololoholo Wildlife Rehabilitation Centre in Hoedspruit.

Established back in 1991, the centre provides expert veterinary care to injured birds and animals, and, if at all possible, helps them to prepare for a return to the wild. During their treatment, injured animals provide vital educational opportunities to safari guests and local schoolchildren, and help local communities and businesses to make changes that can help eliminate some of the dangers faced by wildlife.

A visit here will reveal many heartwarming stories of how passionate people can make a real difference.

LEOPARD CREEK GOLF COURSE

SCENIC FLIGHTS

Take to the skies

The scale and majesty of the Blyde River Canyon - the world's deepest green canyon - can only be truly appreciated from the air. On a scenic helicopter flight from Royal Malewane (timed to fit in between your morning and afternoon game drives, so you don't miss a moment on safari), you'll look down on an astonishing landscape.

Think lush green slopes, a winding river and spectacular waterfalls. The transformation from the Lowveld to the mountains could not be more complete as you ascend, and then follow the course of the river. Alight for a picnic lunch in a secluded, scenic spot that can't be reached in any other way, and seize the moment to take stunning pictures as a reminder of your flight.

ELEPHANT ENCOUNTERS

Meet the gentle giants

Camp Jabulani is known for its exceptional elephant experiences. The herd of rescued elephants at Jabulani are eloquent ambassadors for their species, and for the conservation challenges that they and all African wildlife increasingly face.

You'll have the opportunity to spend time with the elephants, up close and personal, and watch them go about their daily routines, including the always popular waterhole swimming experience. TIMBAVATI MUSEUM VISIT

Learn more about all creatures great and small

The Timbavati Museum – also known as the Graeme Naylor Museum – very much deserves its reputation as a hidden gem of the Lowveld. Located at Chi Mani Mani, around 30 minutes' drive from Royal Malewane, this small museum focuses on the remarkable natural history of the Timbavati and other protected areas that make up the Greater Kruger.

The fabled white lions of Timbavati are the subject of the centrepiece display, but they are no means the only natural wonder at this fascinating educational centre. Discover lesser-known species including the frogs and freshwater fish of the Greater Kruger, and discover the secrets of an elephant's six sets of teeth.
