CyberTracker

Originating in South Africa in 1994 when the first CyberTracker assessment took place in the Greater Kruger, CyberTracker Evaluations are now conducted across the globe as one of the only organisations to offer a standardised testing format in tracking. It was a process designed to celebrate and employ ecological knowledge of indigenous trackers in southern Africa (namely the San of the Kalahari) in wildlife research and conservation. While not all the best trackers in the world are certified by CyberTracker, the system does offer a means to identify the skill level of those who have participated.

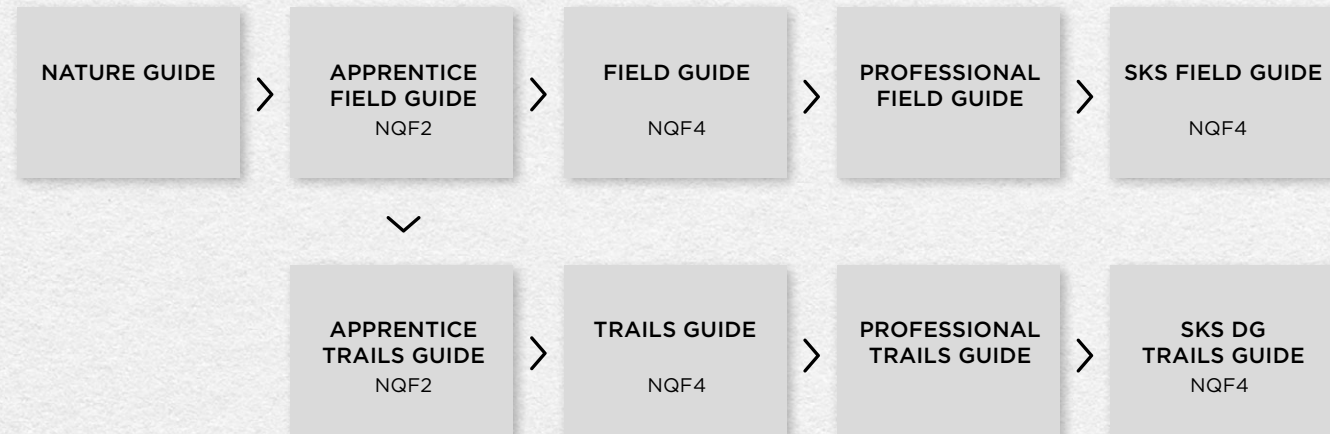

A third Master Tracker (Jonas Mhula) retired from Royal Malewane after many years in January 2022, while a fourth, Wilson Masiya, passed away in 2015, leaving a remarkable guiding legacy.

Today, Juan and Lucas are the only two active Master Trackers in the Greater Kruger National Park.
