A UNESCO World Heritage Site and home to the famed Great Migration, an annual movement of wildebeest and other herbivores that thunder across the Greater Serengeti-Mara ecosystems, one of the greatest wildlife spectacles on earth.

### Why visit the Serengeti?

World-renowned for its vast open grasslands and exceptional wildlife sightings, Tanzania's magnificent Serengeti National Park boasts 35 species of plains game, as well as prolific birdlife.



### HOME TO THE GREAT WILDEBEEST MIGRATION

Of all the documented animal migrations, East Africa's Great Migration is one of the world's most famous, sought-after and photographed wildlife events. It is the astounding, never-ending natural trek of hungry herbivores across the limitless plains of Kenya's Masai Mara and Tanzania's Serengeti. We're talking more than 1.5 million wildebeest, 500 000 zebra, 18 000 eland and 200 000 Thompson's gazelle that are constantly on the move.

### ENDLESS SAVANNAH PLAINS

Known as Siringit, the Maasai word for 'endless plains or the place where the land runs forever', the vast ecosystem of the Serengeti is famous for its untarned landscapes of open grasslands, wooded hills, riverine and acacia forest, mountains and savannah which allow for excellent sightings of abundant wildlife.

### UNESCO WORLD HERITAGE SITE

Large prides of lion, the teeming multitudes of its Great Migration of wildebeest and zebra and the infinite expanses of open grasslands combine to form the most powerful and alluring vision of Africa. The park is surrounded by history and you can immerse yourself in culture, meeting the Maasai people, visiting Olduvai Gorge or in the west Lake Victoria.

### RENOWNED BIG FIVE GAME RESERVE

This vast park offers an extraordinary diversity of eco systems and wildlife sightings, with big herds of buffalo, elephant, lion, leopard and black rhino throughout the park. # **Travel Tanzania** and beyond

Visiting East Africa and travelling across this vast landscape requires much thought and attention. Contact your preferred travel specialist to assist with your travel plans.

### **GETTING TO** THE SERENGETI

Coastal Aviation, Auric Air and Regional Air Services offer daily departures from Arusha and Dar es Salaam. These flight networks link all of the major parks, reserves and and Beyond lodges.

Daily non-direct flights connect the same parks, reserves and &Beyond lodges to Zanzibar.

Flight networks connect to the Masai Mara via two points, one via Kilimanjaro and Wilson Airport in Nairobi, and the other via Tarime and Migori.

The Serengeti, Tarangire and Lake Manyara are accessible by road from Arusha.

Flights connect to Kigali via Mwanza and to Entebbe via Musoma.

# Great Wildebeest Migration

### ONE OF THE 7 NATURAL WONDERS OF THE WORLD


Considered the most thrilling spectacle in the animal kingdom, this epic journey migrates from Tanzania's Serengeti to Kenya's Masai Mara.

THE WORLD'S LARGEST OVERLAND MAMMAL MIGRATION


The annual movement of wildebeest and other herbivores across the Serengeti–Mara ecosystem consists of more than 1.5 million wildebeest, 500 000 zebra, 200 000 Thompson's gazelle and 18 000 eland.

THE ANIMALS MIGRATE OVER 800KM (500MI.) Due to the sheer size of the herd, the animals have to move to be able to survive. The herds generally follow the rain, as where there is rain, there is fresh grass. Once grass is depleted in one area, they will move on to a grassy area.

It's estimated 500 000 wildebeest calves are born annually. The annual movement of wildebeest and other herbivores across the Serengeti-Mara ecosystem is rarely the same in terms of precise timing and direction.




The herds are usually calving on the short grassy plains in the southern Serengeti. This area is made up of nutrient rich soil important for the wildebeest and their calves. A diverse eco-system – forested areas, marshes, soda lakes and big open plains.



The herds are moving, in splinter herds, up through central Serengeti to the Western corridor. A great time for days out with a picnic lunch to find the herds and see them moving in long lines. Excellent leopard sightings in Central and lion and elephant in Grumeti.


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# Great Wildebeest Migration (cont.)



Splinter herds usually congregate in the western corridor and start moving north. The herds move northwest, towards &Beyond Grumeti Serengeti Tented Camp, where dependent on the rain. The animals can be seen crossing the Grumeti River towards the Northern Serengeti.

### JULY – OCTOBER



The big herds congregate in Northern Serengeti and the Masai Mara. Following the rain, the herds cross over to the Masai Mara and then often return to the Serengeti. This continues for a number of months. There are over 10 common river crossing points.

# NOVEMBER – DECEMBER

The migration herds are on the move again, down past Grumeti or straight down to the Central Serengeti. Often breaking away they move south via the eastern, western and central Serengeti. The herds move at a different pace with many going through the Lobo area towards the southern plains.

### Our camps in the Serengeti

he three camps have been specifically set up and designed to capture the essence of the Serengeti in three extremely different areas of the park, offering not only a varied experience, but also different accommodation options.

### &BEYOND SERENGETI UNDER CANVAS

The &Beyond Serengeti Under Canvas camps attempt to anticipate the movements of the Great Migration, bringing guests as close as possible to the wildebeest action, as well as exploring magnificent resident game. These camps are mobile and move five times a year. When staying here you will connect to the African bush, sitting round the camp fire at night and showering under the stars.

#### &BEYOND GRUMETI SERENGETI TENTED CAMP

Set in the remote western reaches of the park, on a by-water of the Grumeti River. In this area, there are few other lodges, and one rarely sees other vehicles. This secluded part of the Serengeti has large resident lion prides and an annual topi migration, making game viewing experiences exceptional with the feeling of exclusivity in this remote part of the Serengeti.

#### **&BEYOND KLEIN'S CAMP**

Deep in a remote corner of the game-rich Serengeti National Park, a 10 000 hectare (24 700 acre) wildlife concession leased from Maasai landlords offers guests the ultimate, exclusive, Tanzanian safari. Night drives and walking safaris in the private concession allow guests to explore the nocturnal world of predators or to get an intimate glimpse into the details of the African bush.







### IMPACT INITIATIVES

We collaborate closely with the **Africa Foundation** on community development programmes: Over USD 420 000 invested since 2006 into education and healthcare in neighbouring communities.

**Community Leaders Education** Fund: 42 tertiary level students supported through bursaries.

**Conservation lessons:** Creating awareness through education where over 130 children and adults partake annually.

We are creating **conservation awareness** through education where over 203 children and adults partake annually

**79% of our team** are employed from local communities.

**79% of goods** are procured locally in Tanzania.

We purify our own still and sparkling water on site, at our water purification plant, using recycled glass bottles. Through this we have completely eliminated the use of plastic water bottles in the lodge.

We are a part of the **Lionscape Coalition**, which supports lion conservation efforts through the Lion Recovery Fund.

**Recycling:** All plastic, glass, and materials such as old engine oil are sent away for re-use and recycling.

### Energy measurement &

management: Energy use is tracked and reported on a monthly basis. This includes the use of wood, petrol, diesel, electricity, gas, paraffin and charcoal.

We take steps to **conserve water**, including monitoring usage closely
