WILDLIFE TALKS



Three times a year, we present « Wildlife
Talks » in five elementary school in Maun,
Tsao and Nokaneng, to introduce the
children to the wildlife of Botswana and
to educate them about the importance
of protecting the pristine environment
in which they live. At the end of these
conferences, we organize a competition
between students, allowing the three best
from each school and their teachers to
spend a discovery weekend with us.

During their visit we play games and our guides take the students on safari through the Kalahari or Okavango lands to discover Botswana's incredible wildlife. The children come back enchanted, with stars in their eyes and the desire to learn even more about Botswana's ecosystems.






SCHOOL BUS

In 2013, The Feline Fields Trust organized donations for the purchase of a School Bus to transport the youngest children from Sexaxa village in Ngamiland to and from Matlapaneng Primary School near Maun, 10 km away. We have also pledged to cover the operating and maintenance costs of the bus, as well as the salary of the driver, Mma Mapodise, and we continue to do so today thanks to donations from the Feline Fields Trust.

Since the bus was put into operation, it transports fifty to seventy children to school twice a day. Teachers have noticed a sharp increase in school attendance and a decrease in tardiness and fatigue due to the grueling distance the young children had to travel five days a week. The student passing rate has since risen to 85%.










The School Bus was the right answer to the plight of children who had no choice but to walk in heavy rain and scorching heat to get to school. The donations not only saved the children, especially the first graders, the distance they had to travel each day, but also reduced the risks they faced along the way. The area is inhabited by wild and dangerous animals such as lions and buffalo from the nearby Moremi Game Reserve.

PLAY GROUPS

The Play Groups projects have been one of our earliest commitments since the inception of Feline Fields. We have been developing it since the Lodge was founded. These projects were born out of the lack of early childhood care facilities in remote areas of Botswana. Indeed, we know that quality early development is essential to laying the foundation for success in later life.

We started by creating two Play Groups, one in Tsao and one in Nokaneng, so that the youngest children in the region, aged between three and five, have access to a preschool structure that allows them to develop and socialize during the day.

To accomplish this, we have completely renovated buildings into classrooms and playrooms through donations from the Feline Fields Trust and the dedicated work of volunteers. We outfitted playgroups with indoor and outdoor equipment, built playgrounds with swings, provided school furniture, educational toys, creative arts and fantasy kits to make each Play Group a place where children make great strides to reach their full potential.













Each Play Group welcomes about 50 children per day, under the supervision of three teachers we recruited and trained, representing each of the tribes in the surrounding villages. The women received teacher training in Ghanzi, funded by the generosity of our donors and the involvement of the Botswana government in the project. With the guidance of the teachers, the children are helped to develop fully in the physical, cognitive, psychological and social areas. Today, we continue to fund and maintain the playgroups with the help of our Trust Coordinator, but always including the Village Development Committee, to raise awareness in the villages about the importance of the playgroups for the children and the community.

What's next?

We plan to set up a Play Group in Kaure, a Bushmen village not far from the Lodge, and in other isolated villages afterwards, all in the area surrounding the Lodge. The Bushmen already have some of their children at the Play Group in Tsao, but there are others who stay in Kaure and this village is very small and far away from everything.

BUSHMEN CRAFTS

For women living in rural Bushmen communities, selling craft is one of the only source of independent income.

We encourage Bushmen women to use their skills to create jewelry and other decorative items from colorful beads, which we offer for sale at the Lodge store without commission. This allows them to sell their products locally and receive 100% of the profits from their creations.

Our craft store goal is to empower local artisans to showcase and sell their crafts in order to support their families. By purchasing these items, you can be assured that you are buying authentic locally produced African crafts that will directly contribute to improving the living standards of the Bushmen women and their families.

TUBU COMMUNITY




BIODIVERSITY AND CONSERVATION



GIRAFFES RELOCATION AND REINTRODUCTION PROJECT

Our big project to reintroduce giraffes in the Kalahari area around the Lodge is finally coming to fruition. Unfortunately, the corona virus had forced us to take a break of almost two years!

Main threats to giraffe in Botswana include poaching, habitat loss and fragmentation as a result of expansion of agricultural activity, climate change, and a general lack of education in wildlife conservation. Firstly, to attain a permit to reintroduce giraffes it was essential to establish both that giraffe had been present within the area and why they Nearly disappeared from the landscape. Data showed that they disappeared due to excessive hunting and that the area eco-system would now allow them to thrive again. The overall aim and objective of the project is to



establish a breeding nucleus of giraffes in the region of the Kalahari where the species used to live before.

The achievement of this will result in improved ecological integrity and diversity of the area. In the next few months we will finally be able to

welcome a group of four giraffes.

The acclimatization of the giraffes to their new territory will be done in progressive steps. At first, they will be acclimatized in an enclosure, and then released around the Lodge area with regular monitoring and careful

care to ensure that the species survives and thrives once again on their ancestral lands. Your donation to the Feline Fields Trust will help us monitor their safety and reintroduce more giraffes in the future. 100% of your donation goes to on-the-ground conservation work.


TRAVEL WITH PURPOSE
