



DAY – LEMAGRUT trek

This day will lead you to the top of Makarut / Lemagrut summit -3200m high. The highest volcano of the area.

Leave camp early in the morning and transfer to the foot of Mount Lemagrut, one of the country's highest mountains (3 200 m). Even though altitudes cannot be compared with Mount Kilimanjaro or even Mount Meru, this is a rather sporty hike and you need to be relatively fit to enjoy the climb.



The tough ascent starts right from the beginning of the hike and it shall take about 2 hours to reach the "false summit". As you walk up, the views of the Ngorongoro Highlands & Lake Eyasi become more and more impressive. The next stage makes you walk through a thick forest & it will take you about 1 hour to reach the saddle and eventually reach the summit. From there, the view over the Serengeti open plains is second to none & you will have plenty of time to enjoy the views while you are having a deserved rest and picnic.



During the second part of the day, you will walk through a high valley of grasslands & remote Maasai villages ; your guide will then casually introduce you to the people he knows.



Finish off your trekking with a steep descent and meet back with your safari driver guide.

Note that you will be accompanied by both a Maasai guide & an armed ranger as encounters with wild animals, especially buffalos in the forest are frequent.
