FEBRUARY

Clear, hot days continue through the month with little wind or rain. Morning and evening temps will remain cold. February brings huge flocks of white storks and calving season for the resident zebra and other plains game. Look out for those young ones and their wobbly legs.

❄ 7°C / 45°F ☀ 27°C / 81°F ☁ 41mm / 1.6in

JUNE

Rain showers at the beginning of the month are probable but as the cool, dry season continues game viewing becomes easier and the landscape is now green and vibrant. Warthogs give birth at this time of year so lots of little piglets around.

❄ 10°C / 50°F ☀ 24°C / 75°F ☁ 35mm / 1.4in

OCTOBER

A great time to make the most of the end of the dry season with great game still present in the conservancy. Visitor numbers will be reduced at this time of the year so an ideal time for those looking for some exclusivity.

MARCH

The weather remains consistent but there is an increased chance of rain towards the end of the month. March can be a wonderful time for photographers as stunning views of Mt Kenya are possible. We can also arrange for a guided ascent of Mt Kenya for those looking for a unique challenge.

❄ 9°C / 48°F ☀ 26°C / 79°F ☁ 83mm / 3.3in

JULY

The days are beginning to see less rain with the daytime temperatures feeling much cooler as the winds increase. Pack layers for those chilly days. As the month progresses, the conservancy's rivers and waterholes begin to bring in elephants from the surrounding areas.

❄ 10°C / 50°F ☀ 23°C / 73°F ☁ 44mm / 1.7in

NOVEMBER

The conservancy is shifting into the short rains, bringing afternoon thunderstorms. Warmer winds arrive making the days more comfortable, nights continue to be chilly. A wonderful time for birders with the first arrivals of many migratory birds from North Africa and Europe.

❄ 9°C / 48°F ☀ 24°C / 75°F ☁ 106mm / 4.2in

APRIL

The heavy rains fall in the afternoons with the skies quickly shifting from clear to tumultuous. With the increase in rain, navigating the tracks can become more challenging but the extra effort does add a touch of excitement to your game drives and makes those animal sightings even more rewarding.

❄ 11°C / 52°F ☀ 25°C / 77°F ☁ 134mm / 5.3in

AUGUST

The weather remains consistent. Ol Pejeta is said to have the highest density of predators outside the Masai Mara and August is a great time for viewing. Ol Pejeta also offers a great opportunity to see the very last northern white rhinos and the endangered Grévy's zebra.

❄ 9°C / 48°F ☀ 23°C / 73°F ☁ 54mm / 2.1in

DECEMBER

The warmer winds continue keeping the days cool, as do the afternoon showers through December. With the migratory birds still arriving and the rain encouraging the grasses to grow taller, this is a fantastic time to spot cheetah which use those tall grasses to hunt.

❄ 8°C / 46°F ☀ 24°C / 75°F ☁ 47mm / 1.9in

JANUARY

Normally clear, calm skies with hot days and showers scattered throughout the month. Due to the altitude and landscape, nighttime temperatures are quite brisk year-round. Pack plenty of layers for those chilly morning drives.

❄ 7°C / 45°F ☀ 26°C / 79°F ☁ 33mm / 1.3in

MAY

Camp closed – long rains.

❄ 11°C / 52°F ☀ 25°C / 77°F ☁ 64mm / 2.5in

SEPTEMBER

Overall conditions stay consistent with very little rain and high winds making for clear, cold days. Game viewing remains excellent – you can see The Big 5 in Ol Pejeta making it an excellent option for a standalone safari destination in Kenya.

❄ 9°C / 48°F ☀ 25°C / 77°F ☁ 37mm / 1.5in
