



OL PEJETA BUSH CAMP ACTIVITIES

However you choose to spend your days on safari here, Ol Pejeta guarantees a wonderfully varied safari experience in this unique corner of Kenya and the chance to make a true difference to the future of conservation.

Pricing is determined by the conservancy and subject to change. Children aged 5 and over are welcome to join, unless stated otherwise. Aside from being a beacon in sustainable conservation, the 400 km² Ol Pejeta Conservancy boasts one of the greatest game-to-area ratios of any reserve in East Africa and the highest population of black rhino. From evergreen thickets to gnarled acacia forests, Ol Pejeta Bush Camp offers a diverse range of habitats to explore. The Big 5 can all be found in the area, alongside some of the rarer northern species of Grévy's zebra, Beisa oryx, the locally threatened Jackson's hartebeest and, of course, the majestic black and white rhino. The area also offers excellent birding opportunities with over 200 migrant and resident species in a great ornithological gathering that ensures excellent sightings.

Alongside traditional game and night drives, activities from OI Pejeta Bush Camp focus on the unique conservation and community projects in the conservancy. A visit to the conservancy is not complete without spending time at the Endangered Species enclosure where you can encounter the last remaining two northern white rhino in the world.

To maximise your time here, we recommend a minimum of three or four nights to allow time to enjoy the conservation activities alongside more traditional safari activities. If you choose to stay longer, there is more than enough to do here to keep you busy for a week as OI Pejeta Bush Camp offers Asilia's largest range of game activities among its entire portfolio.


GAME DRIVES

Learn about the varied animal species and birdlife of the conservancy on a game drive from Ol Pejeta Bush Camp. Let our expert guides inspire you with their knowledge and explore this diverse conservancy. Vehicles are close-sided and can seat up to four people. We offer all guests an opportunity to try our electric vehicle which is powered by the sun and offers guests not only a carbon neutral drive but also a silent one. This vehicle can seat up to six people.

NIGHT DRIVES

Game Package: Included Full Board: US\$70 per adult /US\$35 per child

Dusk and the early evening just after the sun has fallen below the horizon is a thrilling time to be on safari. Antelope come out to feed in the cool air, predators take advantage of the cloak of darkness to stalk their prey and nocturnal species such as aardvark, zorilla and white-tailed mongoose begin their day. Join a knowledgeable guide on a night drive and seek out the action that takes place after darkness falls.





ACTIVITIES AT AN ADDITIONAL COST

Please note the Conservancy does take credit cards but it requires a trip to Control and the activities can be very popular, so we strongly recommend pre-booking to avoid disappointment.

MEET THE NORTHERN WHITE RHINO

US\$70 per adult /US\$35 per child

Today, only two northern white rhino remain in the world and both are found at OI Pejeta Conservancy in a 2,8 km² enclosure protected by 24-hour armed security. Take the opportunity to visit the enclosure, learn from the keepers about the efforts being taken to preserve the last of this highly endangered species, as well as view Grévy's zebra and Jackson's hartebeest in a private and intimate setting.

Morning visit: 8:30 am or 11 am Afternoon visit: 3 pm or 4:30 pm — duration 1 hour. Maximum six people per visit and physical interaction with the rhinos is relatively restricted.





HORSE RIDING WITH RHINOS

(Endangered Species Enclosure) *US\$70 per person.*

Suspended until further notice

Minimum age for children 10 years. Children between 10 and 14 years will need to be joined by a suitably riding qualified adult or quardian.

The chance to ride amongst the endangered species including the northern white rhinos is a once in a lifetime experience. This predator-free area is wonderful to explore on horseback, with the chance to also encounter other of the endangered species such as southern white rhinos, Grévy's zebra or Jackson's hartebeest.

Morning rides: 8 am or 10 am and Afternoon rides: 2 pm or 4 pm — duration approximately 1 hour. Riding hats and tack are provided. Riders must wear suitable footwear, long trousers and sleeves. Maximum of six riders in a group. The rides will only be open to experienced riders and some proof of riding ability will be required at point of booking; clients judged to be of insufficient riding ability will not be permitted to undertake this activity.



DOG TRACKING

US\$70 per person

Visit the conservancy's bloodhound dog kennels and learn about the training that transforms these canines into anti-poaching patrollers. After your tour, you can play a game of human-canine hide and seek, trying to evade the dogs and finding a spot to hide within the Morani Information Centre. A great way to interact, get a bit of exercise for you and the hounds as well as assist in their training.

Morning visit only: 8:30 am, maximum group size of six, minimum age 12 years. Closed toe-shoes recommended. In case the dogs are deployed we will refund money or try to reschedule the activity.

LION TRACKING

US\$70 per adult /US\$35 per child

Several lions on the conservancy have been fitted with radio collars and you can learn how to track them with the researchers with a special tracking device. When you locate a pride, you will learn how to identify the individuals by notches on their ears, whisker patterns and other distinguishing marks, and all data is passed to the Ol Pejeta Ecological Monitoring team in order to further understand these magnificent predators. Guests remain in the vehicle at all times.

Morning activity: 6:30 am

Afternoon visit: 3:30 pm — duration approx. two hours,

minimum two - maximum six people.

RHINO MONITORING AND IDENTIFICATION

US\$70 per person

An exciting and educational walking adventure through the conservancy in the company of the rhino monitoring team. Committed to monitoring and protecting the rhino, these experienced rangers know each of the rhino by name and have a wealth of interesting stories to share about them. Learn how to identify individual rhino by their unique ear notches and assist the rangers in the collection of valuable data about their body condition, habitat, and activity.

Minimum age of 12 years. Morning activity is at 6:30 am – 8:30 am and afternoon activity at 3:30 pm – 5:30 pm. Suitable closed walking shoes are required



RUNNING THE WILD

US\$40 per person

Keep your fitness levels up while on safari to counteract all the delicious food you'll be eating by joining the OI Pejeta Conservancy rangers on their early-morning run. They do this daily to keep fit, and we can arrange for our guests to join them on a run and have a cup of coffee with them afterward to learn more about their work to keep the wildlife on the conservancy safe. A fun and rewarding way to start your day.

Available on Wednesday and Friday at 7 am, maximum six people, minimum age 12 years. Suitable running shoes are needed as well as the ability to run a minimum of five kilometres without stopping.





WILDLIFE - LIVESTOCK INTEGRATION

US\$70 per adult /US\$35 per child

Ol Pejeta operates a unique wildlife-livestock integration model; balancing over 7,000 cattle with conservation. During the activity guests will learn about the creation of biodiversity hotspots and either help move one of the conservancy's predator proof cattle bomas or assist in a cattle spray race.

Morning activity: 8 am duration of two hours. Closed shoes recommended. Maximum six people.
