WHERE IS DUKE'S CAMP

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Duke's Camp sits on an island, in the enormous 220,000-acre concession slightly north of the renowned Vumbura and Duba Plains concessions on the Northern side of Botswana's Okavango Delta. This wonderfully rich habitat of savannah country, seasonal floodplains and permanent waterways supports varied and diverse wildlife, including everything from buffalo, elephants, big cats, wild dogs and phenomenal birdlife.

WHEN IS A GOOD TIME TO GO

Duke's Camp is open all year round with excellent game viewing. Water levels are highest in April to October for exploring on mokoros and boats. At other times of year, water activities may be restricted.

Dry season: April – October

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HOW DO I GET THERE

Direct flights from Cape Town and Johannesburg to Maun and then take a small charter plane, or heli, to an airstrip near the camp.

WHERE WILL I STAY

Hidden on an island in the wilds of the Okavango Delta, Duke's Camp has 8 stylish canvas tents resting on raised wooden decks, widely spaced under shady trees with mesmerizing views of the lagoon. There are 5 twins and 2 doubles and a family room, each with an ensuite bathroom, flush loos, indoor showers, and private veranda.

WHAT WILL I EAT

We are renowned for menus that are fresh and original. Meals are plated, not buffet style. Please inform reservations of any dietary requirements prior to travel.

FULLY INCLUSIVE RATE INCLUDES

Airstrip transfers, all meals, daily activities, local drinks and laundry are included. Flights, premium brand beverages, discretionary tips/gratuities, items of a personal nature and personal travel insurance are excluded.

WHAT ARE THE FACILITIES

The main mess area includes a small comfy lounge (with a well-stocked drinks cabinet), tea, library and dining area, with a 24-seater vintage dining table often placed under the leadwood trees. There is a swimming pool and separate jetty, and in front of the mess tent a 'firepit' from which to look out over the lagoon or up at the night sky.

WHAT DO I NEED TO KNOW

- The entire camp is run on solar power.
- There is 24-hour electricity in the tents.
- We welcome children 6 yrs and older.

- Wi-Fi is available in camp, at the pool area.
- Charging facilities are available in the rooms.
- Our vehicles are open, with rooftop seats, and accommodate a maximum of 7 guests.
- We can accommodate a maximum of 20 guests in camp.
- Please consult your doctor for recommended vaccinations.

- Morning and afternoon game drives.

- Spend the night fly-camping on a remote, lantern-lit island.**
- Boating and mokoro safaris.*
- Helicopter flights over the Okavango Delta and to view ancient rock paintings.**
- Spa treatment.**
- Fishing: 01 Mar 31 Dec (no fishing permitted Jan Feb due to breeding season).
- Cooling off around the swimming pool.
- Head out by heli on a community visit to meet with some of our community based outreach partners in the nearby villages. You'll also spend time with one of our conservation partners to see first hand how together we are able to make a difference to wildlife conservation in the area. **
- * During low water season from Oct Jan, mokoro & boating may be limited as these activities are subject to water levels.
