

SELINDA RESERVE | NORTHERN BOTSWANA

Selinda Explorers Camp is located in the 130,000-hectare Selinda Reserve of northern Botswana. It is built on the banks of the Selinda Spillway, about one hour west of its sister camp, Selinda.

This classic camp transports us back to the time of authentic safaris but with a modern twist and hospitality. The camp's focal point is the Bedouin-style main area with a lounge and separate dining room. The four guest tents provide comfort and style but with a magnificently raw spirit. Subtly placed under the shade of the riverine forest, the camp is designed in the style of the early explorers, both in philosophy and practice. Whiling away afternoons under the canopy of African ebony and Mopane trees, interspersed with walks and canoeing, make this a respite from a traditional safari camp's typical routine.

This authentic tented camp draws on classic East African safari traditions with beautifully detailed campaign-style furniture made from recycled hardwood and soft furnishings from Zanzibar and the East. This is an unassuming camp, light on its footprint but heavy on its experiential luxury. The atmosphere of the camp is one of bush elegance with a relaxed style, complemented by attentive staff, private, professional service and fabulous food.

Selinda Explorers Camp is an ideal property for those guests who want to experience Botswana's extraordinary wildlife but in the most private setting. Selinda Explorers Camp is perfect for individual travellers, couples, families and small groups.

The camp sits in a prime predator habitat, in a location which we handpicked based on exploring this area for years. Lions, leopards, are cheetahs are regularly seen. The opportunity to see wild dogs is also possible when they periodically hunt these parts. Good densities of giraffes, buffalo (in the dry season), and all the antelope – even including roan, sable, and recently spotted eland – are possible sightings.

At the peak of the dry season in late September, the Selinda Reserve has been documented to hold up to 9,000 elephants. There is phenomenal bird life along the Spillway's banks for those looking for some 'lifers'.

Selinda Explorers Camp can accommodate up to 10 guests.

#### ACCESS DIRECTIONS

- Light aircraft transfers from Kasane (55 mins) and Maun (45 min) airports;
- Private Air charter access available;
- Selinda Explorers Camp is a 50-minute drive from its airstrip;
- Airstrip co-ordinates: 18°34'41.9"S 23°29'16.8"E;
- Airstrip length: 1000m.







# ACTIVITIES Wildlife Viewing

Selinda Explorers Camp focuses primarily on the traditional safari activities of guided walking adventures with licensed, armed guides. There is simply no better way to experience the magic of this unique destination. These walks are ideally combined with wildlife-viewing activities such as heading out on a canoe or safari vehicle. Canoeing along the Selinda Spillway is possible when the spillway floods each year in the winter.

Early morning, late afternoon/ evening or even full day safari drives are done in our custom-built, open Toyota Land Cruisers specially designed for our conditions and photography, including fold-down windscreens, raised roofs, photographic bars, and multi-plug inverters. Each Land Cruiser is fully stocked with reference books, drinks, and snacks. While our wildlife viewing focus remains on the most comfortable times of day (early to mid-morning and late afternoon to evening), spending a whole day out in the wilderness is not uncommon.

Our safaris will often continue into the evening in search of nocturnal species. Night drives are incredibly prolific, and while they take patience, sightings commonly include lesser-known nocturnal mammals and even lion and hyena hunts.



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Our schedule is flexible, and guests are encouraged to create their own itinerary according to their interests with guidance and recommendations from our professional guides.

#### Fishing

A rod/reel kit is available for those who want to try their cast in the Selinda Spillway between March and December on a catch and release basis (water lever dependent).

#### Private vehicle option

Available for more flexibility upon request at extra cost, not compulsory for families travelling with children.

#### Private Guides

Private guides are encouraged and welcomed.

#### Scenic Flight and Champagne Stop

Enjoy an aerial viewing experience with great scenery across the Linyanti/Savuti and Selinda Spillway. Add a 15-minute champagne stop on palm island en route. Must be booked in advance and is subject to extra cost and availability.

#### CENTRAL FACILITIES

- Main tented area with separate lounge and dining areas;
- Coffee/tea/bar station;
- Fire pit with seating;

- Plunge pool;
- Hammocks.

#### FOOD AND BEVERAGE

- Three delicious and wholesome meals are provided per day from our 'bush kitchen'.
- We are extremely flexible on timings. Picnic breakfasts or lunch (or both) are commonly enjoyed while out on safari:
- All drinks and beverages are included, including imported spirits and champagnes;
- Dining style: group meals or individual dining;
- Indoor and outdoor dining locations;
- All dietary requirements are catered for from regular to vegan to children; prior notice required.

#### ACCOMMODATION DETAILS

#### Bedroom features

- Three double Selous style canvas tents at ground level on slightly raised platforms consisting of main bedroom, with separate dressing area and en-suite bathroom;
- One 2-Bedroom Family custom-designed canvas tent on a slightly raised platform consisting of two bedrooms, each with their own separate bathroom and dressing area;
- Private verandah with daybed and view;
- Standing fan;

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- Coffee/tea station;
- Writing desk;
- All bedrooms can be either twin or double bed configuration.

#### Bathroom features

- En-suite with flush toilet, shower (with hot & cold running water), double basins;
- Soap, shampoo, conditioner and lotion provided.

# ACCOMMODATING CHILDREN AND SHARING ACCOMMODATION

- We look forward to having children stay with us who are 6 years and older;
- The family tent can accommodate a family of 4 quests;
- Families will be combined with other guests on all activities;
- Scheduled wildlife viewing activities, including safari drives, guided walks, and power boating, are available to guests from 6 years when accompanied by their parents or guardians. Where available, canoe and mokoro activities specifically welcome guests aged 8 years and above;
- Young children must be supervised as the camp is open, with high predator densities in and around camp and there is water surrounding camp;
- Great Plains Young Explorers program thoughtfully designed to explore a range of experiences and topics from birding to cooking to art to tracking wildlife.

#### **FITNESS**

Yoga mats are provided in each tent.

#### LAUNDRY

Included in nightly tariff - next day service, weather permitting.

## POWER AND COMMUNICATION

#### Power

- The camp is run by solar power with generator back up;
- The system produces 220V, 24-hour electricity;
- Electrical lighting and universal plug point available in guest tents.

#### Internet & Mobile

- Wi-fi available in guest tents;
- No mobile signal.

### HEALTH AND SAFETY

#### Health

- Malaria: Minimal exposure risk- Malaria prophylaxis are recommended if guests are concerned; however, this is a remote area with little occurrence:
- Guests must hold comprehensive medical insurance and emergency evacuation insurance;
- Senior staff all has first aid training;
- Nearest decent medical facility is in Maun, and then Johannesburg.













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#### Possibility of Disabled access

The camp layout is not conducive to wheelchair bound guests due to dirt pathways and uneven terrain.

#### Safety

- This remotely located camp is unfenced to wild animals that do move through the property especially at night;
- Fire extinguishers in every tent.

# MONEY MATTERS Safes

Safes are provided in every tent.

#### Accepted Payment on Location

- Staff gratuities can be paid by credit card or in Botswana Pula, South African Rands, US Dollars (2004 bills or later only) or GB Pounds;
- Guest extras can be settled by Visa and MasterCard credit cards (No Amex or Diners).





Guide Tent


