We are the only private operator granted concessions to operate in both Odzala-Kokoua and Noubalé-Ndoki National Parks in the Republic of the Congo.

We limit all departures to 12 people maximum, ensuring an intimate and personalized experience for all guests.

NATIONAL PARK, REPUBLIC OF THE CONGO



One of Africa's oldest parks, protected since 1935, the 13,500 sq.km. Odzala is home to a captivating variety of flora and fauna. The most thrilling sightings include Western Lowland Gorilla, Chimpanzee, Forest Elephant, Forest Buffalo, Spotted Hyena, and Bongo. GORILLA RESEARCH CAMP



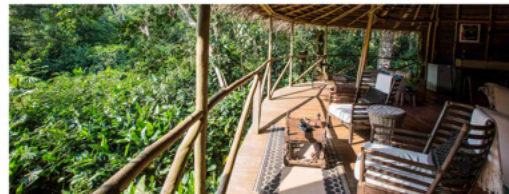

Guests arrive at Lango after an epic, two-hour river journey that begins with kayaks and ends with a wet and wonderful walk through the bai – a literal immersion in the jungle. Once there, you'll follow the footsteps of elephants through streams and forests, train your zoom lens on magnificent birds in the bai, and dry off on a walk beneath soaring kapok trees.





With wraparound walkways and elevated bungalows, Lango Lodge maximizes the views of Lango Bai- a wide, marshy clearing that acts as a magnet for huge flocks of Green Pigeons and African Grey Parrots as well as herds of Forest Buffalo and Forest Elephants.

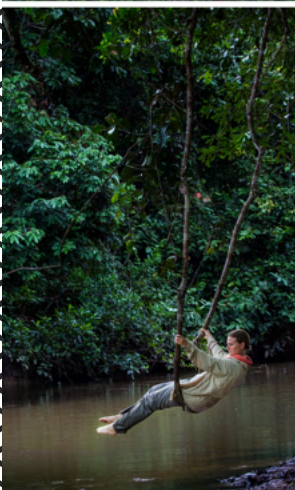
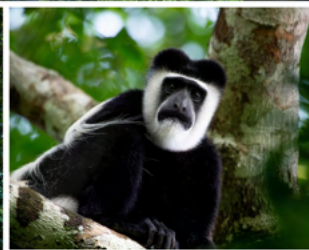

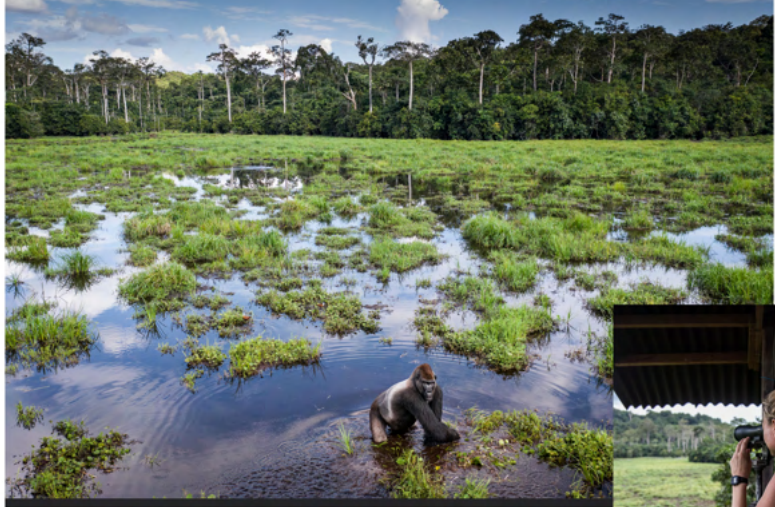
Nouabalé–Ndoki

NATIONAL PARK, REPUBLIC OF THE CONGO



Part of the Sangha Tri National Forest, a World Heritage Site, Nouabalé–Ndoki abuts the majestic Sangha River and is blessed with breathtaking baïs, including the majestic Mbeli Baï, where Western Lowland Gorillas, Forest Elephants, and even Chimpanzees and Bongo congregate. As one of the only undeveloped wilderness areas in Africa, the park offers the opportunity to experience the incredible biodiversity of the jungle – thousands and thousands of species – in a pristine state.





Mbeli Bai is a 13 hectare large swampy forest clearing in the south-west of Ndoki NP, with minimum levels of disturbance. Since 1995, the Mbeli Bai Study has been a long-term conservation program based at Mondika that has provided unique insights into the social organization and life history of the western gorilla. Researchers have observed over 400 gorillas at Mbeli Bai since the start of the study, along with hundreds of forest elephants, as well as bongo, sitatungua, forest buffalo, and other rare species.
