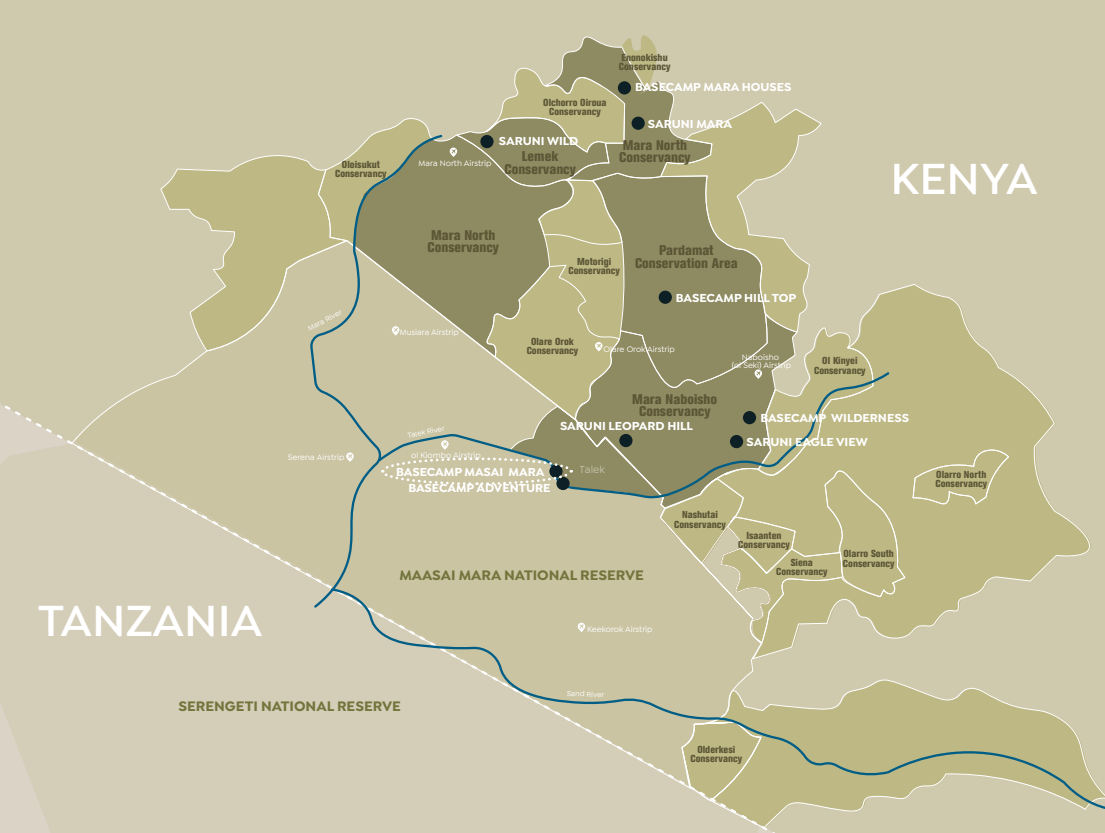

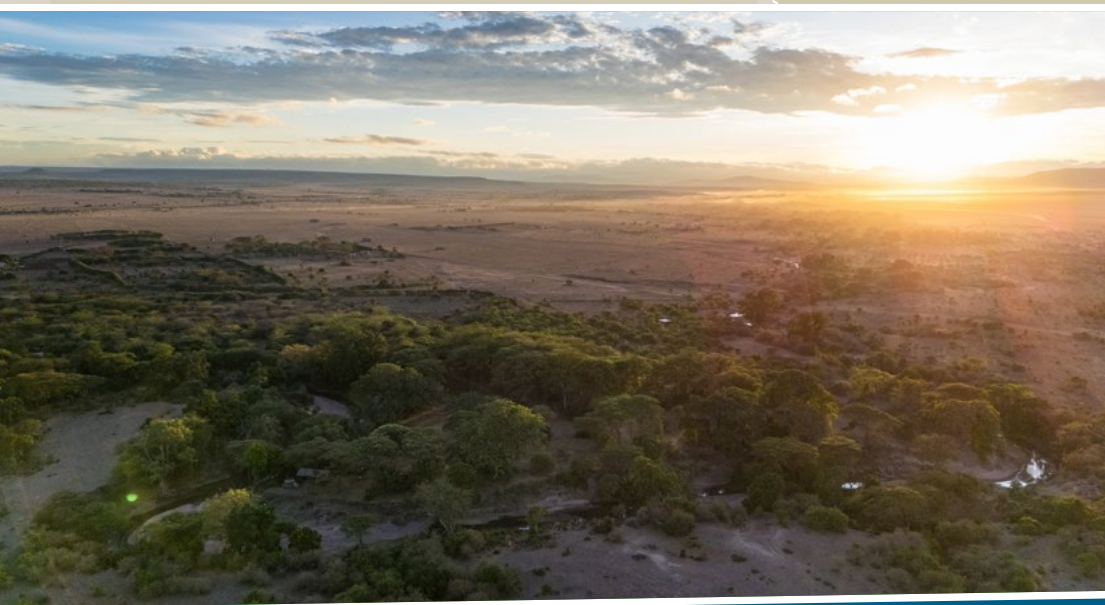

# INTRODUCING BASECAMP MASAI MARA

Basecamp Masai Mara is situated in a shady spot along a private section of the Talek River, with private footbridge access to the Masai Mara National Reserve and exceptional views across the plains of this most iconic of all wilderness areas. The trees growing alongside the river offer shade and privacy, and provide a sanctuary for an incredible variety of birdlife. With the neighbouring Maasai community within easy reach, the stage is set for not just an incredible wildlife safari, but also for the opportunity to meaningful engage with the original custodians of this remarkable landscape, and discover how the Maasai's traditional lifestyle has allowed them to exist in harmony with both the ecosystem and its wildlife.

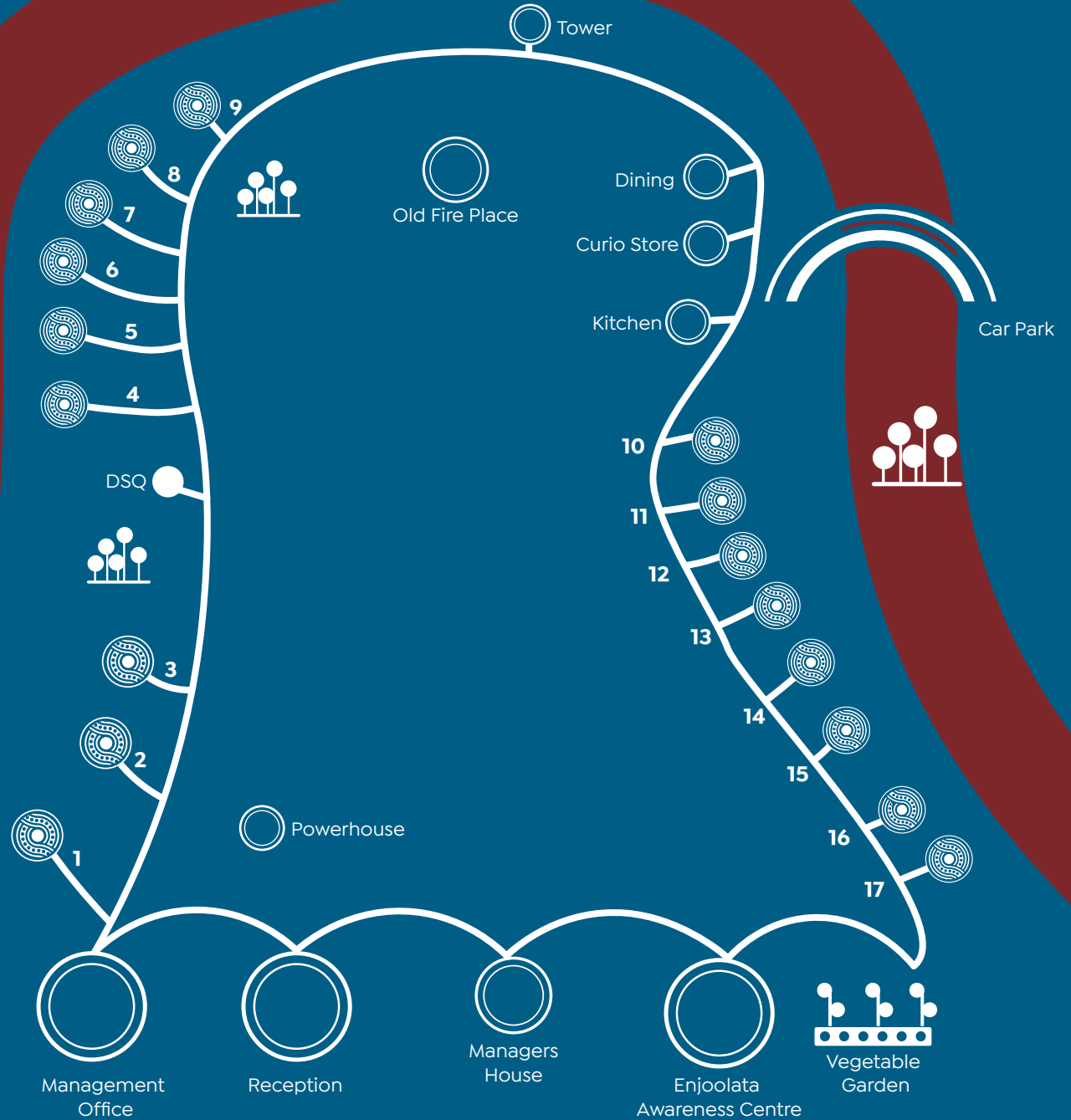

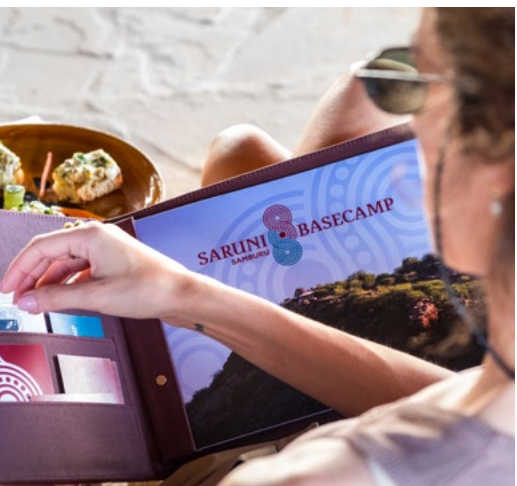

Saruni Basecamp believes fully and invests significantly in community development and conservation.

- The majority of the team members at Basecamp Masai Mara are Maasai from the local communities. They are trained and employed to enable local communities to benefit directly from the lodge being in their area.
- Opportunities are provided for local artisans to sell their craft items, giving them an alternative revenue stream and contributing to the revival of interest in traditional skills.
- Saruni Basecamp sponsors young Maasai to train as guides at the Wildlife Tourism College of Maasai Mara, and lead future generations of conservationists and safari guides.
- The camp helps to protect the Masai Mara ecosystem, and contributes to the preservation of protected wilderness areas.
