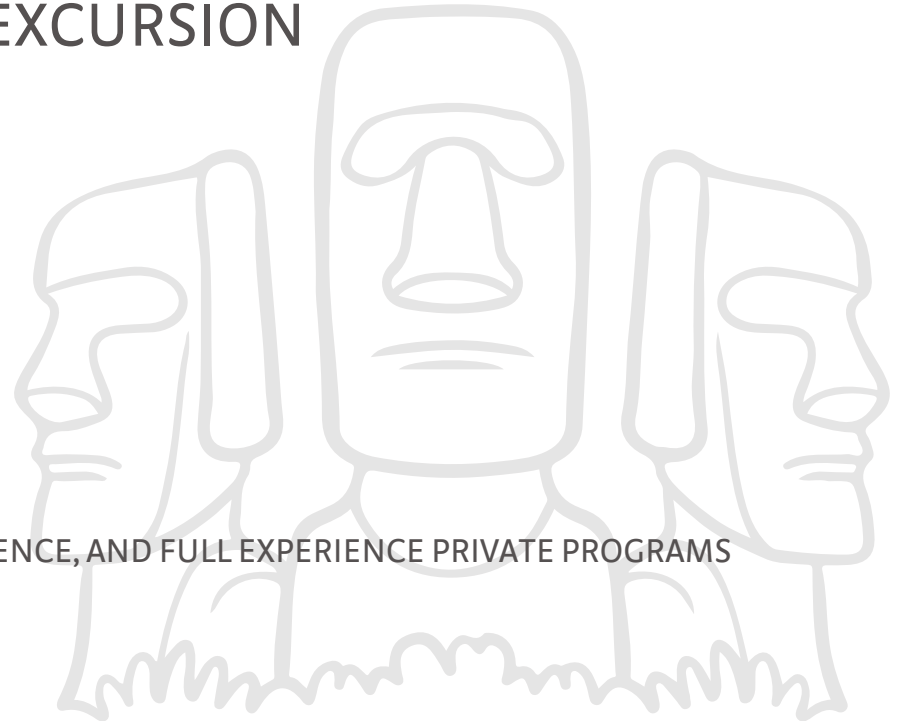

LOCAL CULTURAL EXCURSION

◆ MANA TUPUNA

Begin your morning by visiting the historical arrival point of Hotu Matu'a and other early Polynesian navigators to the island.

Learn about the fascinating history of the island's first civilization while enjoying the natural beauty of Anakena beach. Continue the excursion to Ovahe, a mythical pink sand beach, to discover an ancestral crematorium and admire its unique beauty. Conclude the morning at Te Pito Kura, where you'll find the largest Moai on the island and the curious stone formation of Te Pito Kura.

In case of inclement weather, the visit to Ovahe will be replaced by a guided tour in a covered sector of petroglyphs known as Papa Vaka.

◆ TARAI MOAI

Start your afternoon by exploring the emblematic Rano Raraku, the main quarry where the Moai were carved.

Unravel the mystery behind the construction and transportation of these monumental statues, 397 of which lie there in different stages of construction.

After discussing the different theories behind their construction, get your cameras out for our visit to the renowned Ahu Tongariki, a ceremonial structure with 15 pristine, restored Moai.

◆ VAITEKA

Your morning adventure takes you east of Hanga Roa to visit Puna Pau, an archaeological treasure where the unique red volcanic scoria, Hani Hani, is found.

This material shaped the Pukaos, iconic headdresses worn by the Moai. The journey continues to Ahu Akivi, a platform unique for housing the only seven sea-facing Moai on the island.

There, learn about their historical significance and different theories about their orientation.

Finally, take a brief walk to Vaiteka, and wander through the awe-inspiring caves which unfold another mysterious chapter of Rapa Nui's history.

◆ HE RONGO O TE MANU

Embark on an excursion to unveil the majesty of Rapa Nui's most splendid locales.

Start with the awe-inspiring Rano Kau Volcano crater, a sight of grandeur that embodies the island's beauty.

Explore the rich natural bounty it offers, a living testament to its enduring contribution to local livelihoods.

Then proceed to Orongo, a ceremonial village that hosted the captivating Tangata Manu contest.

Ready your lenses to capture this historic site and visualize the daring participants.

Delve into the competition's political and religious significance that shaped the culture. In this ancestral settlement, discover the unique Hare Keho construction style, exclusive to Orongo and an architectural influence for the Nayara Hangaroa hotel.

Finally, journey to Vinapu, where a distinctive platform diverges from others on the island, adding to the archaeological enigma. Here, encounter one of the rare female Moai.

◆ KO TE RIKU

Commence with a visit to the Sebastian Englert Anthropological Museum, a gateway to the captivating history of Rapa Nui.

Here, uncover the mystique of the ancestral ceremonies, delve into the symbolism of the Moai, and gain insights into the ancient local customs. Progress on to Ahu Tahai, an archaeological marvel boasting three ceremonial platforms - an undeniable cornerstone of the island's heritage that allows you to connect with the past and explore fascinating remnants of history first-hand.

Finally, traverse through the key spots of charming Hanga Roa town. Discover the rhythm of daily life in Rapa Nui and experience the unique allure of this hospitable enclave. As you meander through its streets, seize the opportunity to visit prominent attractions like the bustling market and a traditional church.

ADVENTURE AND TREKKING EXCURSIONS

If you want to experience Rapa Nui in a unique way, you can venture out with our team of guides on a trekking adventure to the most remote areas of the island.

◆ TREKKING POIKE

One of the three main volcanoes that gave birth to the island, where you can find unique archaeological remains such as Vai a Heva and explore the famous Virgins' Cave or Ana o Keke.

◆ TEREVAKA

Trekking on Mount Terevaka where you can reach the highest point on the island and enjoy a 360° view of the entire Rapa Nui island.

◆ CAVES

A circuit where you can discover the different caves hidden in the landscapes of Rapa Nui, starting with Ana Kakenga, then continuing to Ana Te Pora, and ending at the famous Banana Cave or Ana Te Pahu.

◆ TREKKING TO MIRADOR DE RANO KAU

The adventure commences with a bus ride from the hotel to the Conaf office, marking the trail's start.

The path leads us to the Rano Kau viewpoint, the island's largest crater and one of its most captivating sights. Journey through eucalyptus forests, absorbing their unique beauty and aura.

Traverse along the crater's rim towards the volcano's lowest part, offering an unparalleled view of the motus or islets, the stage for a significant ancestral competition of Rapa Nui culture.

◆ THE BIRDMAN

Kickstart this hike at Vinapu, home to a platform connected to an ancient theory about Rapa Nui's settlement. Continue along a trail ascending towards the volcano's most breathtaking sector, Kari Kari. Marvel at the panoramic views of the motus and the crater.

The expedition concludes at the Rano Kau viewpoint, where our bus awaits to escort you back to the hotel.

◆ FULL DAY TREKKING HANGA O TEO

For an enchanting exploration, embark on a journey across the island's North Coast.

This is a must for those seeking less-trodden paths and hidden surprises. Gear up for an approximate 6-hour hike starting at Ahu Akivi, featuring seldom-visited archaeological sites, preserved in their historical charm and mystique. This region is only accessible by foot or horseback. The excursion culminates at the picturesque Anakena Beach.

◆ 4 X 4 EXPERIENCE

If you are a traveler who likes to explore destinations independently, you will have the opportunity to exchange one excursion for 3 hours of quad biking (ATV), allowing you to discover the island at your own pace.

◆ MOUNTAIN BIKE KO TE MIRO O ONE

We start from the hotel on mountain bikes and ride along the interior road that traverses the island to the Miro O One area, where we descend to the south coast on a dirt road.

On the return journey along the coastal road, the excursion will visit different ruined platforms. Depending on the pace of the travelers, the excursion may also visit the Vinapu area, extending the duration by a few minutes.

◆ MOUNTAIN BIKE CAVERNS

A 100% mountain bike experience through the caves of the island, known as Roiho in the local culture.

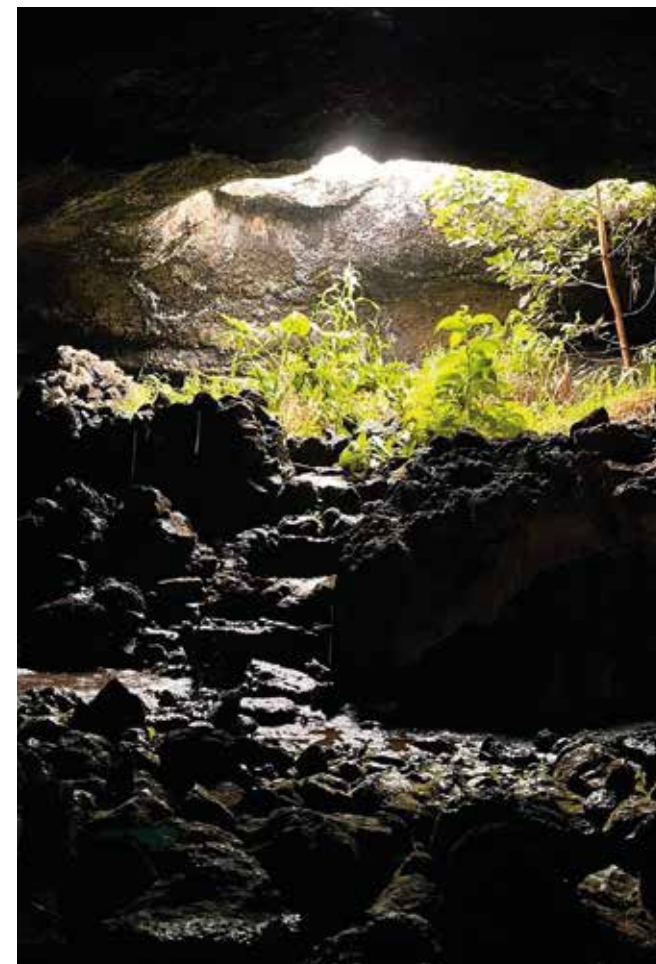
This excursion starts from the hotel, advancing along the coast until reaching the dirt and gravel road.

This engaging activity immerses you in the rich tradition of Polynesian body painting. This ancient art, having evolved into modern "tattooing," once marked the zenith of artistic expression in the ancient world. The aesthetic and social aspects are intertwined with tales of gods, spirits, legends, and the everyday experiences of Polynesians.

The experience culminates with a photo session where you'll don ancestral clothing and takona, providing a remarkable memento to share with your friends.

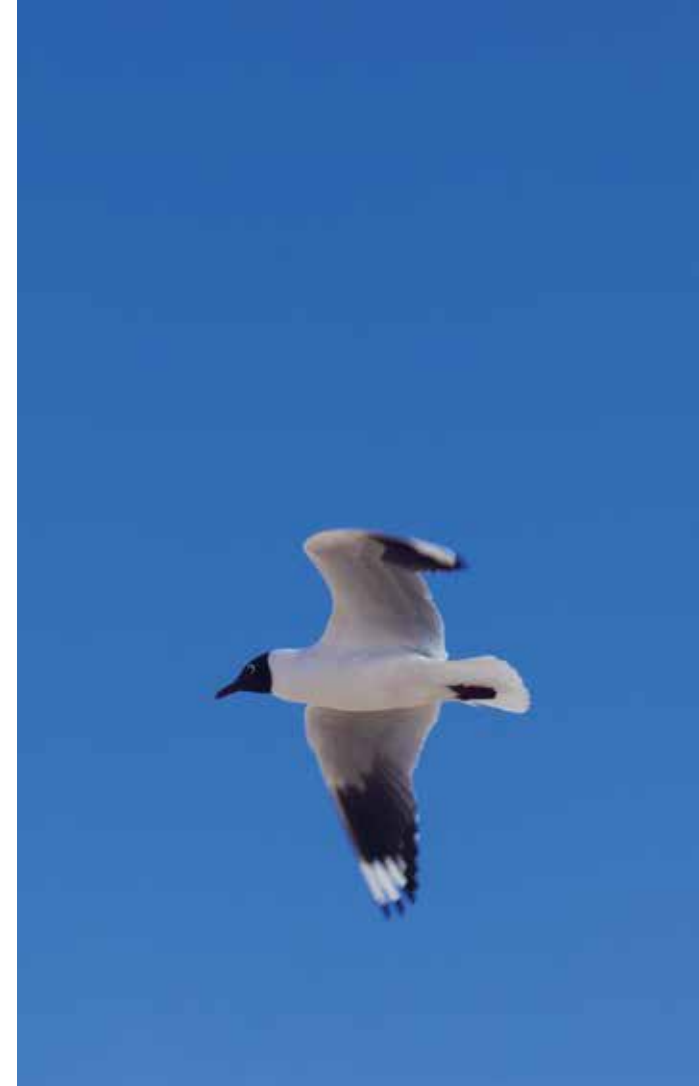
This hands-on experience includes top-notch ingredients and all essential utensils for a wholesome culinary journey.
