A truly authentic bush camp and eco lodge, proud to be a part of the important Madikwe conservation initiative.

A rustic and intimate unfenced camp - the only one of its kind in Madikwe - our family owned and run eco lodge firmly follows "thrills over frills", following ecotourism principles which allow you to tread responsibly in the African bush.

Unapologetically off-grid, the simplicity of open fire cooking and no electricity, the safari showers (with hot water!) and raised wooden cabins allow you to completely disconnect and escape, enabling you to fully appreciate a genuine bushveld experience.

Situated at the very heart of the malaria-free Madikwe Game Reserve in the North-West Province, Madikwe is one of South Africa's top wildlife and game-viewing destinations with extensive and impressive viewings of:

- The Big Five (lion, leopard, elephant, buffalo and both black and white rhino),
- The extremely rare and endangered wild dog and cheetah and almost every other South African predator you can think of,
- · A multitude of plains game, and
- 478 species of birds.





Built around a large Mosetlha tree and accommodating up to 16 guests, the 10 raised wood and thatched cabins (including 2 sets of adjoining family cabins) have comfortable twin beds and partly open sides for you to truly connect with the bush.

Each cabin has its own private toilet and shower, which is a short walk away. Water for the safari-style bucket showers is heated by a donkey boiler - a complete hit with our guests.


We can also provide exclusive use of the camp for up to 18 people.

Guests at Mosetlha enjoy spectacular up close and personal wildlife sightings in comfortable open 4x4s with our expert field guides on twice daily game drives throughout the entire Madikwe reserve. Each game drive includes a stop at a picturesque spot for coffee or sundowners.

Arrive back from your evening sunset drive to the camp beautifully lit by oil lamps, with a delicious campfire-cooked meal waiting to be shared with guests from all around the world at our big dining table.







RATES

Our rates from August 2024 are R 4995 per person per night sharing and R 5495 per person per night single.

As we are a rustic unfenced bush camp we only accommodate children over the age of 6 years old. We do not have children's rates.

A minimum two-night stay applies to all bookings.

These rates INCLUDE all of the following:


- · Comfortable accommodation in raised thatched cabins with twin beds (with private toilet and shower),
- All meals per day,
- Two game drives a day with our expert field guides,
- · Snacks on your drives,
- Emergency medical evacuation insurance.

These rates EXCLUDE:

(Guests will need to bring cash for these expenses, as we do not have credit card facilities at the camp)

- The Reserve Entrance Fee, currently R180.00 per person once off, which we collect from you on behalf of North West Parks and Tourism Board. (Subject to change)
- Madikwe Guest Conservation Fee, currently R180.00 per guest per night, which we collect from you on behalf of the Madikwe Concessionaires Forum. (Subject to change)
- Alcoholic and Soft Drinks. (We sell a reasonable selection of beers, wines, spirits, and soft drinks. Please note that we no longer sell single use plastic bottles of still water. We stock glass bottles, for sale at R120 each, which can be filled with our delicious and safe borehole water. You are, of course, welcome to bring along your own refillable water bottle.)
