

DUBA EXPLORERS CAMP

DUBA PLAINS CONCESSION | NORTHERN BOTSWANA

Duba Explorers Camp in Northern Botswana is tucked away in the northeast corner of the Duba Plains concession, a 33,000-hectare reserve in the Okavango Delta.

Due to its location at the northern reaches of the Okavango Delta, the surroundings are dominated by permanent floodplain, interspersed with seasonal floodplains and grasslands and pockets of mopane and acacia woodlands. Under a canopy of mature jackalberry, leadwood, mangosteen and sycamore fig trees the camp has year-round shade. The camp's location provides clear, unobstructed views across the surrounding water channels and allows cool breezes through the camp and guest tents.

The camp, part of our Explorers Collection and designed by Dereck and Beverly Joubert, explorers themselves, embodies the golden age of safaris and the spirit of exploration. The camp consists of five tents of airy canvas on raised decking stylishly furnished with campaign writing desk, private verandah and en-suite facilities. Guests wake up to panoramic views of the Delta floodplains and, during the flood season, the water channels link to open water filled with flowering water lilies and tall papyrus. The main area is set under sweeping marquee canvas, on raised decking with an open-concept dining and lounge area. Being part of a floodplain for most of the year, the camp is on an island surrounded by beautiful landscapes and water courses. The camp is accessible only by two, gum pole bridges. During your siesta, lounge on the daybed on your veranda, absorbing the peacefulness and tranquillity of your surroundings. During the flood season you might even be lucky to catch sight of spotted neck otters swimming and eating. Listen out for the prolific birdlife. At night, let the hippos sing you a to sleep. Sometimes, the roar of a lion cracks through the night as he calls out to his pride.

During a stay at Duba Explorers Camp guests step into the shoes of the early adventurers. Explore the water channels associated with the Ngoga River system by boat or traditional canoes (mekoro), meandering through channels created by hippos and elephant. The mekoro allows you to glide silently through the channel systems and experience an undisturbed water world around you. With over 400 bird species, birding is unsurpassed, with spectacular species like the malachite kingfisher zipping past you in a burst of colour. Vehicle safaris in this paradise allow for exciting encounters with the predators who are resident in the area. On guided walks explore the islands, wetlands and plains, following the tracks and interpreting the signs of the wild. Guests might even be lucky enough to get a glimpse of a rare sitatunga or an elusive leopard. Enjoy the excitement of catch and release fishing where one can study the various delta fish species up close.

ACTIVITIES

Wildlife Viewing

Duba Explorers Camp is a combination activity-based camp. Wildlife viewing activities centre around guests predominantly exploring the surrounding Okavango Delta's permanent channels by guided walks, drives, mokoro, and boating (when water levels allow). The mokoro and boating activities are truly invigorating yet peaceful experiences, allowing for wildlife and birding viewing from unique perspectives.

Guided wildlife walks, Duba Explorers Camp's specialist wildlife viewing activity, are available with licensed, armed guides. There is simply no better way to experience the magic of this unique destination, and these walks are ideally combined with wildlife-viewing activities such as heading out on a mokoro or boat.

Early morning, late afternoon/ evening or even full-day safari drives are done in our custom-built, open Toyota Land Cruisers specially designed for our conditions and photography, including fold-down windscreens, raised roofs, photographic bars, and multi-plug inverters. Each Land Cruiser is fully stocked with reference books, drinks, and snacks. While our wildlife viewing focus remains on the most comfortable times of the day (early to mid-morning and late afternoon to evening), spending a full day out in the wilderness is not uncommon. Duba Explorers Camp does have access to shared traversing areas north of the Duba Plains Reserve and often includes these exciting areas in guests' safari drives.

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Our safaris will often continue into the night in search of nocturnal species. Night drives are incredibly prolific, and while they take patience, sightings commonly include lesser-known nocturnal mammals and even lion and hyena hunts. Our schedule is flexible, and guests are encouraged to create their own itinerary according to their interests with guidance and recommendations from our professional guides

Fishing

A rod/reel kit is available for those who want to try their cast in the Delta between March and December on a catch and release basis - water level dependant.

Private vehicle option

Available for more flexibility upon request at extra cost, not compulsory for families travelling with children.

Private Guides

Private guides are encouraged and welcomed.

Scenic Flight and Champagne Stop

Enjoy an aerial viewing experience with great scenery across the northern part of the Okavango Delta. Add a 15-minute champagne stop on palm island en route. Must be booked in advance and is subject to extra cost and availability.

CENTRAL FACILITIES

- Main marquee canvas area with lounge and dining;
- Coffee/tea station;
- Outdoor fire pit;
- Unique swimming pool near the main area for guests to enjoy;
- Great Plains Safari Boutique selling locally and regionally produced crafts, many of which support local community projects in the nearby Okavango panhandle. The Boutique also stocks the d&b clothing line: Dereck and Beverly Joubert have inspired this bespoke range of clothing they typically wear, and which is perfect and cool while on safari yet elegant when in the city. All materials are responsibly sourced.

FOOD AND BEVERAGE

- All meals included and prepared by our Executive Chefs and their teams;
- Three delicious meals a day are included. We are extremely flexible on timings. Picnic breakfasts or lunch (or both) are the norm due to very active safari drives, often delivered to you whilst in the bush!
- All drinks and beverages are included, including imported spirits and champagnes;
- Individual dining;
- Indoor and outdoor dining locations;
- All dietary requirements are catered for from regular to vegan to children - prior notice required.

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ACCOMMODATION DETAILS

Bedroom features

- Stone coloured canvas tents with zipper double doors that lead to mid-sized tented rooms;
- Private verandah with views of floodplains;
- High quality binoculars in every guest tent;
- Mosquito nets over beds as well as netted windows and doors;
- Tea/Coffee station;
- Standing fan;
- Either twin or double bed configuration;
- Writing desk.

Bathroom features

- En-suite with flush toilet, shower (with hot & cold running water), double basins;
- Soap, shampoo, conditioner and lotion provided.

ACCOMMODATING CHILDREN AND SHARING ACCOMMODATION

- We look forward to having children stay with us that are 6 years and older;
- Triples for children sharing with adults can be arranged upon request;
- Families with children could be accommodated in the same vehicle as other guests;

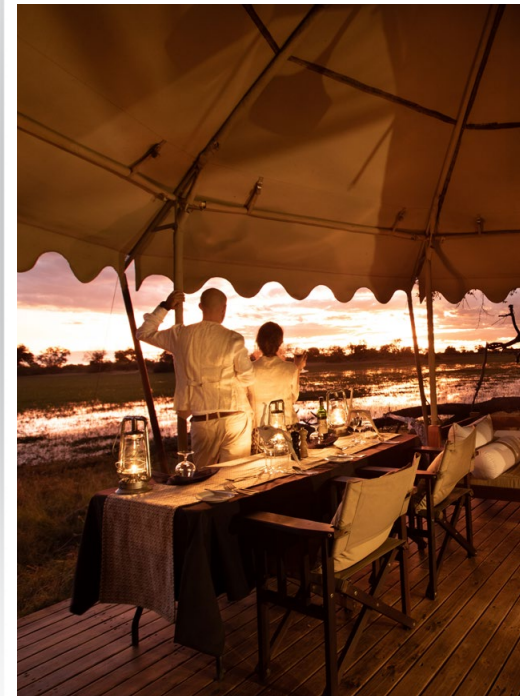
- Scheduled wildlife viewing activities, including safari drives, guided walks, and power boating, are available to guests from 6 years when accompanied by their parents or guardians. Where available, canoe and mokoro activities specifically welcome guests aged 8 years and above;
- Young children must be supervised as the camp is open with high predator densities in and around camp and there is water surrounding camp;
- Great Plains Young Explorers program – thoughtfully designed to explore a range of experiences and topics from birding to cooking to art to tracking wildlife.

FITNESS

Yoga mats and light weights are provided in each tent.

LAUNDRY

Included in nightly tariff - next day service, weather permitting.



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POWER AND COMMUNICATION

Power

- The camp is run by solar power;
- The system produces 220V, 24-hour electricity to the tents and main area;
- Universal plug points in each tent.

Internet & Mobile

- Limited Wi-Fi available in guest tents;
- No mobile reception.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

Health

- Malaria: Minimal exposure risk– Malaria prophylaxis are recommended if guests are concerned; however, this is a remote area with little occurrence;
- Guests must hold comprehensive medical insurance and emergency evacuation insurance;
- Senior staff all has first aid training;
- Nearest decent medical facility is in Maun, and then Johannesburg.

Possibility of Disabled Access

The camp layout is not conducive to wheelchair bound guests due to dirt pathways and uneven terrain.



Safety

- This remotely located camp is unfenced to wild animals that do move through the property especially at night;
- Fire extinguishers in every tent.

MONEY MATTERS

Safes

Safes are provided in every tent.

Accepted Payment on Location

- Staff gratuities can be paid in Botswana Pula, US Dollars, Euro and GB Pounds - preferably in cash - to the staff member concerned who has truly exceeded expectations in terms of hospitality, service, and experience;
- Guest extras and curio sales can be settled by Visa and MasterCard credit cards (No Amex or Diners).

Great Plains Earth Academy

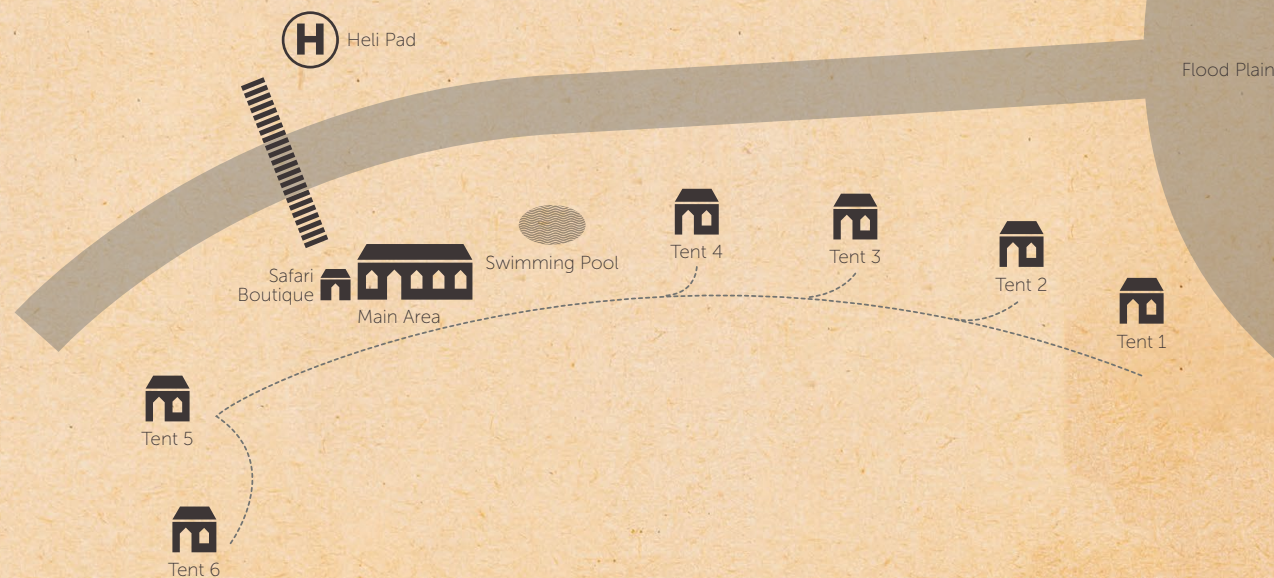
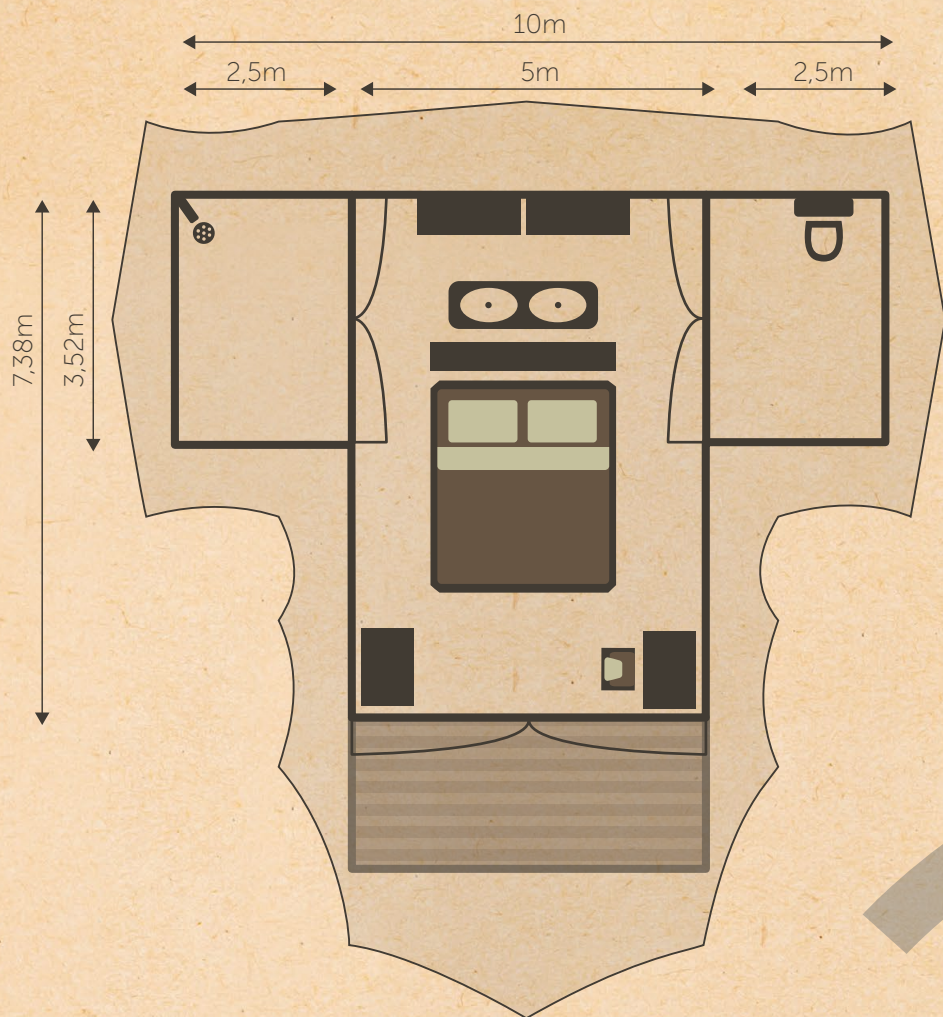
