## **JANUARY**


## **MARCH**

Mid-March sees the start of the long rainy season and most days have intermittent rain. This is when many animals calve, which can attract predators and make for quite spectacular game viewing. A great time for those looking for fewer vehicles on the crater floor.

**APRIL** 

The fantastic game viewing continues. Many of the resident game species are concentrated around permanent water, making viewing easy and rewarding. The temps remain consistent - sunny warm days, possibly freezing at night.



## MAY

The long rains continue but the flowers continue to bloom, and visitor numbers remain low. Another excellent month for those that don't mind the cooler temperatures and want to experience fewer vehicles than normal.

The temperatures are starting to creep up

a little but it's still advisable to bring cold

weather gear for those early starts. The

game viewing on the crater floor is at a peak

and as such vehicle numbers are high. Keep

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**SEPTEMBER** 





The long rains are ending, and the dry season brings sunny days with cloudless skies. Nighttime temps can drop to freezing on the crater rim, so it is important to bring cold weather clothes. Excellent game viewing and photography conditions - so expect vehicle numbers to be higher than May.



The short rains, which last about one month. can occur anytime between October and December. Despite potential rain the game viewing remains excellent and the increased hours of daylight allow for more viewing opportunities, for both game and birds.



# **DECEMBER**

If the rains have not yet fallen, they are still possible at this time. Otherwise conditions remain consistent: excellent game viewing and pleasant daytimes. As we approach the festive season, crowds and vehicle numbers will increase to the highest volumes seen all year.


