

FACT FILE

Anvil Bay, Chemucane is a private and exclusive barefoot beach camp on a rare untouched stretch of coastal wilderness in Mozambique’s most southern national park, - Maputo Special Reserve (MSR). Created with the smallest possible footprint to preserve the wilderness and the special sense of place, the camp is set up on the beach under canvas and thatch. A rare unspoilt beach where guests get to experience life close to nature but with all the comforts of home.

ACCESSIBILITY

- **Helicopter** – A 20 to 25-minute Private Helicopter Charter from Maputo International Airport direct to Anvil Bay.
- **Guided Maputo Safari Tour of MSR** - Approximately 4hours in duration. A half day guided tour of the Maputo Elephant Reserve includes a light breakfast for early departures from Maputo, as well as tolls, ferry & Park entrance fees.
- **Kosi Bay Border Transfer** - Minimum of two and maximum of three adults with luggage. Approximately 3 hours.
- **Maputo Road Transfer** - Minimum of two and maximum of three adults with luggage. Approximately 3-4 hours

MALARIA

Mozambique is a malaria country. Anvil Bay is situated in a low risk malaria area; however, we would recommend that you consult your travel doctor prior to departing your home country. Malaria is at its highest prevalence during the warmer and wetter months of November to April. The species of mosquito which carries malaria is only active at night. The best prevention is to avoid being bitten – For your convenience Mosquito repellent is available in your room. We also suggest that you wear long-sleeved shirts and long pants in the evening.

WHEN IS A GOOD TIME TO VISIT?

Winter Season – May - October

The winter months are the coolest with often fresh winds off the sea. The days are warm and pleasant and the sea rarely drops below 22 degrees. During these months, the hump back whales migrate up and down the coast affording wonderful sightings whilst on the Ocean Safari or from the beach.

Summer Season – November - April

The summer months are regarded as the best times to visit the beach – the sea is warmer up to 27 degrees; the temperatures are hot and the summer rains are tropical and cooling after the heat of the day. From November, through to January Leatherback and Loggerhead Turtles come ashore to lay their eggs and then the hatchlings scramble from their nests from January through to the end of summer. Turtle walks on the beach at sunrise and sunset are your best opportunities to witness this amazing natural sight.

WHAT TO PACK?

We recommend light cotton clothing that lets the body breathe. You will more than likely only need your swimwear, sarong, sun hat, sunscreen and sandals for the hot sand. Bring something warm for windy evenings and comfortable walking shoes if you intend enjoying one of our Dune Forest trails. For the rest of your stay, shoes are completely optional and no dress codes apply. Camera equipment and plenty of memory cards and a recharger. Binoculars. If you wear contact lenses, we recommend that you bring a pair of glasses in case you get irritation from the sand.



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
