# Singita Grumeti

## Location of Singita Grumeti [A]

Spanning over 350,000 acres of untouched wilderness, Singita Grumeti is located in northern Tanzania, forming part of the Serengeti Mara ecosystem. Singita Sabora Tented Camp is ideally positioned on the renowned migratory route traversed annually by more than a million wildebeest.

## Location of Singita Sabora Tented Camp [B]

Singita Sabora Tented Camp is situated in an untouched wilderness area of Grumeti Reserves, spanning over 350,000 acres in northern Tanzania. As you arrive at this intimate 1920s-style explorer's camp, you immediately sense you're in for a nostalgic adventure. Steeped in character, Singita Sabora Tented Camp surprises guests with an opulence that is delightfully out-of-place with the rugged terrain of the surrounding savannah plains. Here, you are immersed in the palpable pulse of the wild Serengeti; with the added thrill of knowing there isn't much separating you from the elements and wildlife beyond your safe refuge.





# What you need to know

## Best time to go on Safari

East Africa is equatorial so the climate is fairly constant and it is a year-round destination. Tanzania has a light rain season from November to March. This period is known as the 'short rains', often no more than a quick downpour each day, followed by clear sunshine. From December to March the weather becomes increasingly warmer with the 'long rains' occurring between April and May.

## Seasonal Temperatures

Winter (June - Aug)	Average Minimum	18°C	64°F
	Average Maximum	29°C	84°F

The above temperatures are the monthly average. The absolute temperatures differ from these temperatures.

## Your Packing Guide

Cotton clothing in neutral colours is recommended for game drives and bush walks. It is advisable to avoid white and dark colours as they tend to attract certain bugs. No formal wear is required at any of our lodges.

Seasons dictate comfort and comfort dictates clothing, so we recommend that you pack as follows:

- October – April: Casual summer clothes (shorts and cool shirts) and a light sweater/fleece for the cooler morning and evening temperatures
- May – September: Casual light clothing and a light sweater/fleece for the cooler mornings and nights

It is a good idea to bring along the following items to ensure a carefree safari:

- Comfortable walking shoes/track shoes/hiking boots for walks; and sandals to wear around the lodge
- Swimming costume/bathing suits, sun block, sun hat, sunglasses, lip balm, mosquito repellent (The latter two items are provided but you are welcome to bring along your favourite brand)
- Video camera, camera, binoculars, spare memory cards

Please note that in the event of rain during a game drive, waterproof ponchos will be provided.



# What you need to know

## Health Requirements

Singita Sabora Tented Camp is in a malarial zone so it is essential to consider taking appropriate prophylactics. Yellow fever is present in Tanzania and inoculations are compulsory prior to entering East Africa. We recommended that you consult your doctor/physician before travelling.

## Accommodation

- 9 x 1-bedroom en-suite tents

## Amenities and Services

- There is a swimming pool in the main camp area
- Spa and gym facilities are available
- The Singita Boutique & Gallery
- There is a television in the lounge tent of the camp
- Dependent upon area coverage, there is mobile phone signal
- There is complimentary internet (WiFi) access, however due to the remote location of the lodge, the wireless connection can be slow and intermittent
- Electricity/power available: 220 AV. 110 Converters are also available and hair dryers are supplied in each tent
- Children aged 10 and over are welcome. All normal safari activities are tailor-made to suit each family. However in the interest of safety, the participation of children in game activities is at the discretion of your guide

## Activities

- Walking safaris, daytime game drives and spot lit night drives with professional guides
- Visits to the Environmental Education Centre that was developed for the young people of the local communities
- The Equestrian Centre situated at nearby Singita Sasakwa Lodge. There are 18 world-class horses for daily outrides on the plains available for intermediate and advanced riders

- All our safaris at Singita Grumeti are conducted in Land Rovers with a maximum of six guests per vehicle. However, should you wish complete privacy, you may hire a private vehicle on this basis. Sole use of a Land Rover should be reserved well in advance and is subject to availability. Prices are available upon request

## Our Tariffs Include

- Luxurious en-suite accommodation, breakfast, lunch and dinner daily, all drinks (excluding connoisseur wines and French Champagne)
- Land Rover safaris, mountain biking and bush walks accompanied by an experienced guide
- Laundry and valet services
- Telephone calls

## Your Journey To Reach Us

### By Air

- We can arrange scheduled flights or private charters for your trip. All flights land at the Singita airstrip located 45 minutes from the camp.
- On scheduled flights, the weight of luggage is restricted to 20kg (44lb) for checked baggage and 5kg (11lb) for hand luggage

Kilimanjaro - Singita: approximately 2 hours 15 minutes.  
Arusha - Singita : approximately 2 hours

Private aircraft pilots land at their own risk and are advised to broadcast their intentions on frequency VHF channel 118.45. Planes that can land at Singita's airstrip: Beechcraft 1900; King Air; Cessna 406, 402, 404, Twin Otter and Grand Caravan.

## Key species you are likely to see

During your stay at Singita Sabora Tented Camp, you are likely to spot a great variety of wildlife, including cheetah, bearded wildebeest, bat eared fox, black rhino, Maasai giraffe, lion, elephant, buffalo and leopard - and plenty of zebra walking through the camp.
