### SOUTH AFRICAN MUSEUM AND PLANETARIUM

The South African Museum was established in 1825. Collections range from fossils to insects, stoneage tools more than 120 000 years old, side by side with displays of traditional clothes of the last century. The museum also offers a diverse range of exhibitions.

The South African Planetarium housed in the South African Museum is one of two Planetaria in South Africa. Combining sound, light and cutting-edge technology, the Planetarium recreates the night sky. It does not matter what the weather outside, the Planetarium sky is always clear and dotted with bright stars. Set aside in a domed auditorium, this ultimate armchair journey to another world offers education through entertainment to both the young and old.

## ADDERLEY STREET

### COMPANY GARDENS

The garden was formally established in 1652 by Dutch settlers who sought to establish a station at the Cape of Good Hope to service spice-trading sailing ships on the long sea route to the east. Presently the gardens are being enjoyed by visitors for the sheer beauty of its flora and allure of its historic setting.

### SLAVE LODGE

Dating back to 1679, the Slave Lodge is the second oldest building in South Africa and served initially as a lodge for the slaves of the Dutch East India Company and subsequently as the first post office, library and Supreme Court. The museum houses collections of ceramics, toys, silver and textiles as well as artifacts from ancient Egypt, Greece, Rome, and the Far East. Displays on Cape history, Khoisan herders and slavery are on view.

### GROOT KERK

The Groote Kerk is the oldest existing church in Southern Africa. It is one of the most famous churches in South Africa and was built in 1841 on the site of an earlier Dutch Reformed church dating from 1704.

### FLOWER MARKET

The Adderley Street flower market adds a splash of colour to the historical city centre. For the past 100 years, the flower market has sold selection of fresh blossoms to the people of Cape Town on a daily basis. The flower sellers and market have become a must see attraction for visitors to the city. Enjoy the antics of the lively vendors who entertain you. They are a true reflection of the vibrancy of South African culture.

### JAN VAN RIEBEEK STATUE

On 18 May 1899, a statue of Jan van Riebeeck, the first European to settle at the Cape was unveiled on Heerengracht Street. Cecil John Rhodes, a politician and financier of the late 19th century donated the bronze statue to the City of Cape Town.

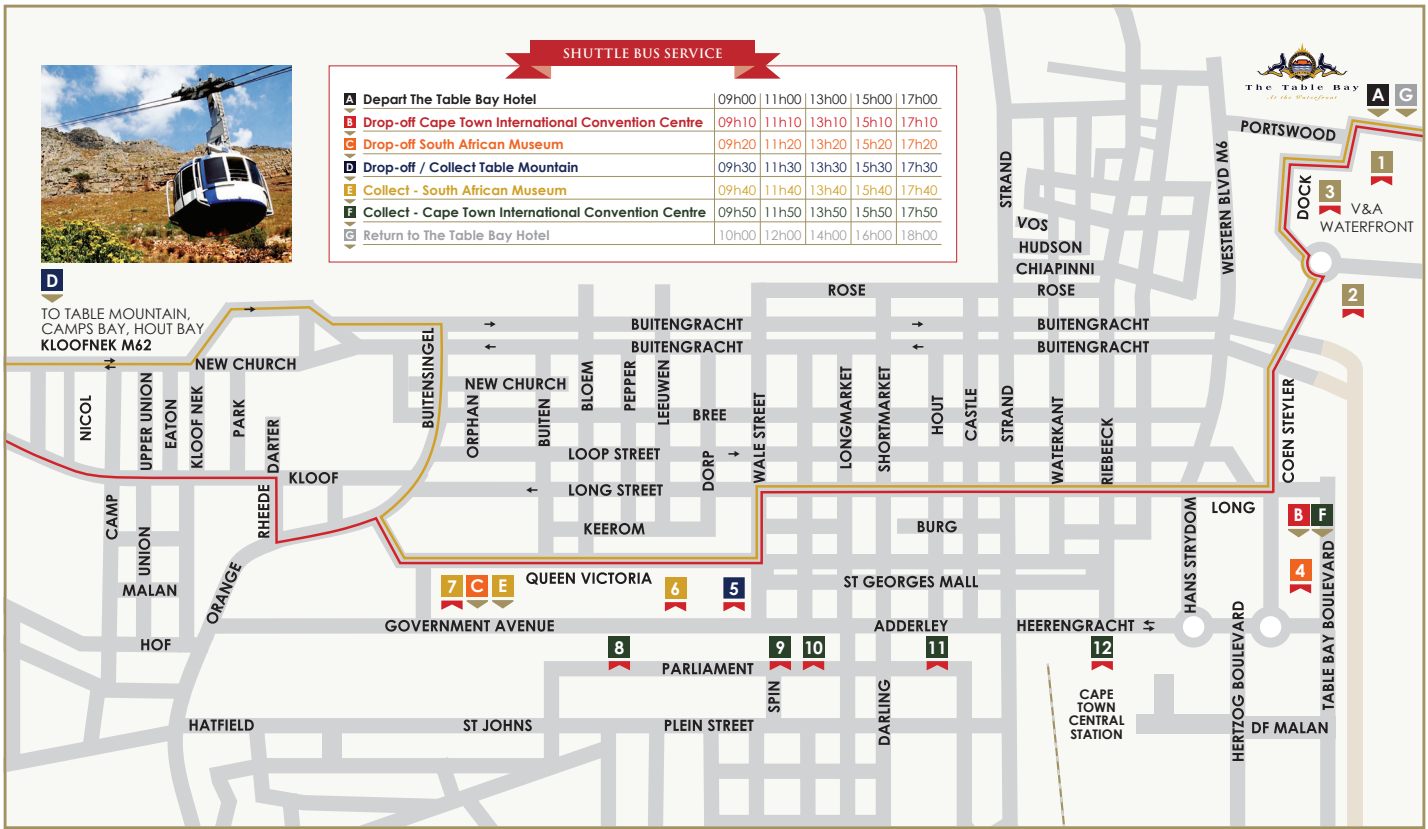

### V&A WATERFRONT

#### V&A SHOPPING MALL 1

Redevelopment of the historic docklands around Victoria and Alfred Basins with a focus on retail, tourism and residential development started at the end of 1989. The V&A Waterfront has given Capetonians a new sense of pride. It has earned its place as one of Cape Town's most visited destinations.

#### BLUE SHED CRAFT MARKET 2

The Waterfront Craft Market and Wellness Centre, also known as the Blue Shed, is open daily. There are a number of craft stalls inside the shed, offering handmade and recycled objects for sale.

The Wellness Centre offers products and treatments to "enhance and balance" your mind, body, soul and lifestyle.

#### TWO OCEANS AQUARIUM 3

The Two Oceans Aquarium opened in November 1995 and is open daily. The southern tip of the African continent is the meeting place of two mighty and bountiful oceans, the Indian and the Atlantic. The Two Oceans Aquarium on the V&A Waterfront, Cape Town is ideally positioned to showcase the incredible diversity of marine life found in these two oceans. The Aquarium is one of the top tourist attractions in Cape Town and over 3000 living sea animals, including sharks, fishes, turtles and penguins can be seen in this spectacular underwater nature reserve.

### LOWER LONG STREET

#### CAPE TOWN INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION CENTRE 4

Set in the heart of one of the most beautiful cities in the world, the CTICC offers a purpose built, state of the art convention facility with high tech infrastructure.

Since it's launch in June 2003, the CTICC has hosted major medical and scientific conventions with thousands of delegates as well as consumer exhibitions and trade shows. The CTICC has become widely regarded as one of the leading convention centres in the Southern Hemisphere.

### WALE STREET

#### ST. GEORGES CATHEDRAL 5

St. Georges Cathedral represents the Anglican Diocese mother Church in Cape Town. It earned its nickname as "The Peoples Church" when it welcomed all races during the apartheid era, despite segregation laws. The cathedral showcases Victorian - era design, complete with stained glass windows and a crypt. Apart from visiting the impressive cathedral, you can take a meditative walk through the cathedral's labyrinth.
