



## DIRECTIONS FROM VIC FALLS TO CAMP HWANGE

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### FROM VICTORIA FALLS

From Victoria Falls you will drive to Hwange town (approx 1 hour's journey – 100kms). As you approach the town, **without turning off**, you will see the ENGEN garage on your right. You will see an old steam train parked on the lawn. Continue past the garage and travel straight on until you cross the railway line. Continue straight out of town for a further 5km

Turn right at the **SINAMATELLA / HWANGE NATIONAL PARK SIGN**.

Please note there is a coal mine on this road and the trucks that carry the coal move very fast, please stay on the left side of the road at all times.

The tar road will end after approximately 5 kms and then you will be on a dust road.

Continue on this road until you come to a small rail crossing which you pass over. Travel for a further 100-200 metres and around the corner you will see a Boom where there will be a National Parks attendant.

You tell the boom attendant that you are travelling through to Camp Hwange.

Travel straight for a further 20 - 25kms. You will arrive at the Sinamatella Camp which is the entrance to the Hwange National Park. You must report to reception and pay the conservation and vehicle entry fees.

Once you have signed in at Sinamatella Camp, proceed through the park.

You now have a further 40 – 45kms to travel from Sinamatella Camp to Shumba Pan. It is a straight road. Do not turn off.

Some of the water points you will see on the way are as follows:

After approximately 25kms you will first pass Mandavu dam which is a large dam that will be on your right side.

Travel a further 12kms to Masuma Dam which has a security gate which you drive through. This is a great viewing point for animals should you wish to stop.

After Masuma Dam, proceed straight on for about 15kms - you will get to Shumba Pan.

To your right you will see a **NO ENTRY** sign with an Elephants skull on top. Turn right here and after 2.8km you will arrive at Camp Hwange.

Alternatively, when you arrive at Shumba water point you can speak to the pump attendants at the picnic site and they will radio the camp and a guide will come and collect you.
