



HOUSE IN THE WILD

ENONKISHU CONSERVANCY

Facts at a glance

- Location** The 'House in the Wild' is perched on the banks of the Mara River, tucked away on a 1000 acre private estate within the Enonkishu Conservancy on the edge of the Maasai Mara.
- Setting** The main house and cottages are set on beautiful grounds, on the banks of the Mara River, within a 1000 acre private estate Naretoi, within the Enonkishu conservancy.
Whilst being on the edge of the best game viewing area, the immediate area surrounding "House in the Wild" is on a working cattle farm, so it is fenced therefore safe for walking, running, horse riding, bicycle riding, offering guests to have a firsthand experience of what living on a traditional Kenyan Farm is like. Great for kids, there are horses to ride, cows to milk, a farm school to visit.
- How to get there** The drive from Nairobi is approximately four hours, directions are available on request.
There are twice daily scheduled flights into Ngerende with Air Kenya or Safarilink.
Ngerende airstrip is a 15 minute drive from the house.
If arriving by private plane, there is a private airstrip on the farm. The coordinates are: S01 04.231'E035 14.127'
- Accommodation** The "house in the wild" is a private 12-14 bed lodge, and consists of a main farmhouse and five cottages.
The Original Cottage: This has two double rooms, sharing a bathroom with a bath and an outside star shower.
Family River Cottage: One double with the option of additional 2 single beds for children at the rear of the room.
Warburgia Cottage: A double en suite with massive bath overlooking the river.
Marula Cottage: This cottage has two large double en-suite rooms with its' own private lawn, verandah and lounge areas. Laundry is done on a daily basis. A crèche / daycare is also available.

Power A combination of generator and solar. Kerosene lamps throughout the night.

Seasons Open all year round

Internet There is free Wi-Fi available in the lounge and on the lawn by the lounge.

Activities The "House in the Wild" team of silver level guides engage their guests not only in the wildlife game drives, but also in nature walks and cultural exchanges, providing the opportunity to learn more about local traditions and customs, geology, biology and indigenous medicine. Guided nature walk, bird walks, game drives, horse riding, farm activities, local school visits, cultural trips, visit to rhino sanctuary, tennis, bush dinner, balloon flights, Maasai dancing or relaxing by the pool.



What is included, Activities

- All meals
